

General Information

The trip to Lithuania was made by the Ornithological Society of Scania to explore the avifauna but also to determine the state of ornithology and environment protection. It is a white spot on most birdwatchers, maps and people living in the country are too busy making their living to be devoted ornithologists. The inefficiency of the communist system has left untouched forests and huge areas of swamps and marshes, something that should give a rich fauna. The agricultural level lies partly at the 19:th century and horses are fairly common. Connected to the big EurAsian landmass this gives the country a large potential for lots of species. Few speak English and very few speak German so there are sometimes communication problems.

Getting there

We flew from Kristianstad in the south of Sweden to Vilnius by a special charter organized by FCY-travels AB (telephone: int+ 46-42 12 87 81). It is also possible to fly from Copenhagen. A ferryboat is planned from Åhus in the south of Sweden to Klaipeda but for the moment the only possibility is to go by boat to Poland and then by car into Lithuania.

Currency

In a short time the currency has changed from rubels to talons and will in late 93 change into lit which is the hope of a stable future currency. Not knowing the rate the country is somewhere between cheap and very cheap rapidly going towards western prices. For souvenir they have excellent amber, linen and of course vodka and sparkling wine.

Food and hotels

There is no obvious shortage of food and the restaurants are good. Hotel standard is okay and typical of the former Eastern-bloc. The efficiency and service are not perfect but improve all the restaurants and shops have the same service as have quite some types of beer to choose between and most of them are good.

Diary and description of localities


17/5 Flying from Copenhagen to Vilnius we had a marvellous view over the Nemunas river and delta and the huge sand reefs outside the coast. In Vilnius we left our luggage at Tafootel and left for fishponds at Arvydai. Artificial ponds are used for producing carp and at the same time good areas for grebes, waders, ducks and storks. We saw *Black Stork* and *Black-throated Greabe*. Lots of different species of frogs were heard and their bell ringing sounds would accompany us the whole journey in this land of wetlands.



18/5 Leaving early next morning towards Moleta and further on to Ignalina. Our first stop was at Glitiskes. We stopped at an old manor-house near the lake and observed raptors. *Honey Buzzard*, *Osprey* and the first *Lesser Spotted Eagle* were observed together with warblers in the park behind the manor house. 10 km towards Moleta we stopped at a marsh and saw some more raptors, tits and *Scarlet Rosefinches*. Lunch in Moleta.

Driving from Moleta toward Ignalina you pass through an area good for *Rollers*. We observed two pairs. We stopped at a 16th century church at Stirinay and saw our first *Spotted Eagle*, Labanoras is an old picturesque village with *Roller*, *Curlew* and *Reed Warbler*. You could walk there for hours amongst horsewaggon and old timberhouses. We went to a big vacation village in Paluse. Since it was out of season we were the only guests and we slept there three nights 10 persons for less than 20 sek. A night walk the lake gave *Nightjar* and *Bittern*.

19/5 In the morning we visited a very nice row-village with lakes and streams. Lots of warblers and finches. Wonderful local atmosphere. (After visiting the national park administration went to the virgin forest area. Huge pine and spruce trees with and aspens in small groups and everywhere lots of dead The dream of a woodpecker. We observed *Three-toed* and *Grey Woodpeckers* and our second *Spotted Eagle* was soaring over. The whole forest is divided into square areas by fire-breaks. Lots of dead trees lie everywhere and it is pretty easy to get lost and walking in some areas is really heavy. On our way back we observed *Black Kite*.

20/5 Going back to Vilnius we pass a bookshop in central town and bought a map and some stamps. At lunchtime we are at the administration centre of Cepkeliu Raistas in the very south east corner of the country. It is a giant high bog with huge wetlands surrounded by very dry sandy pine forests. *White-tailed Eagles* is breeding and so are several pairs of *Citrine Wagtails*. In the surrounding areas we looked for *Hoopoe* without any luck and in the late afternoon we arrived at fishponds near Magionys where we observed of *White storks* and *Ravens* together with one *Ferruginous Duck* and and lots of *Garganeys*, 5-7 *White-tailed Eagles* and lots of other raptors. The road to Druskininkai is really lousy and we are all tired arriving at, the hotel. Hot water and a shower! Druskininkai is a very clean and nice town in German health resort style.





21/5 Going from Druskininkai towards Zuvintas reservation, a shallow eutrophic lake surrounded by wet grasslands and huge areas of wet broadleaved forests. In the lake we took a trip in rowing boats looking at large colonies of *Black Terns* including two *White-winged* and one *Whiskered Tern*. *Savi's warbler*, *Bittern* and *Little Crake* are heard from reed areas. In the afternoon we took a trip to the wet forest SW of the lake we were attacked by millions of mosquitoes of approximately the same size as a helicopter. The forests are dense and a mixture between alder, ash, birch, oak and other broad-leaved trees. In a huge oak more than one metre in diameter we found the nest of *Black Stork*. We also saw *Lesser Spotted Eagle* and *Cranes* in the forest. In the evening we went out into huge grasslands (X) to listen for *Aquatic warblers*. We had very good observations of 5-7 birds and heard them singing as light faded away. We also saw three *Montague's Harriers* which is fairly common in this area. We slept in Miriampole in a huge Soviet imperialistic style concrete hotel.

22/5 Driving towards the coast we stopped at Viesvile forest to look for *White-backed Woodpecker*. We walked along the stream meadows where the German forester had his horses grazing before the First World War. There were lots of beaver ponds and we had a very good observation of *Tawny Owl*. *Hazel Grouse* was common and *Golden Orioles* were heard everywhere. Late this evening we arrived at the coast. Looking for some place to sleep we found an example of long and intensive use of vodka with two small children looking at their drunken parents. Finally we found our sleeping place in the old lighthouse at Ventes Ragas ringing station.

23/5 Finally at the sea. Alone in the morning observing suddenly found three *Rose-coloured Starlings* outside the ringing station. Waking everybody up made it worth while! Third observation in the country. After breakfast we all went to check the Zigzag Helgoland traps. Lots of warblers; and flycatchers, some *Red-breasted Flycatchers* and one *Barred Warbler*. We drove around looking at artificial nests built for *White-tailed Eagles* have had great success with several pairs breeding! At the bridge over Kaiser-Wilhelm Canal we stopped to look at raptors. We observed *White-tailed Eagles* and *Lesser Spotted Eagles*. At huge wet grasslands below the bridge we found 2-3 *Aquatic Warblers* some *Great Snipes* and *Black-tailed Godwits*. Some kilometers further on near a delta lake we found *Dunlin*, *Ruff*, *Little Gull* and *Golden Plover*. Suddenly a huge raptor came over us. After some problems with the identification we found out that this was a three-year-old *Imperial Eagle* a new species for the country. At the next stop, a wet forest area, we found a nest of a *Lesser Spotted Eagle* and observed an *Eagle Owl* and *Corncrake*. After a fantastic day we really wanted to fall into our beds. When we arrived back at the ringing station we had a fantastic meal with smoked fish, bread and meat accompanied with the traditional vodka and sparkling wine.

24/5 The next day some of us took a rowing trip to some sandy islands in the river delta. Lots of *Calidris*-waders were observed but also a *Broad-billed Sandpiper*, *Grey Plover*, *Curlew* and *Caspian Tern*. Going through the reed areas we saw lots of *Shovelers*, *Garganeys* and a colony of *Crested Grebes*.

After a fantastic lunch at the ringing-station we continued our trip to Klaipėda and by ferry-boat to the huge sand reef *Kursiu neranga*. When we arrived at *Juodkrante* all restaurants were closed but *Vitas* and *Lingita* invited us to eat some hot sandwiches in their home.

25/5 This day we started exploring the sand landscape. *Wood Lark*, *Eurasian Skylark* and *Tawny Pipit* are all characteristic species in the dunes. A *Black Kite* and a *Honey Buzzard* passed by. Looking at the very nice architecture in *Nida* we found *Serinus* singing from a television pole. On our way back we visited a colony of *Cormorants* and *Grey Herons*. Just outside the house a *Red-breasted Flycatcher* was singing intensively. In the evening we had a very nice discussion on natural conservation in which *Claus Mayer* from *Naturschutzbund Deutschlands* also participated.

26/5 We started the morning looking at giant carved wood sculptures placed in a forest telling old local fairy-tales. Lots of *Scarlet Rosefinches* and a *Greenish Warblers* completed the list. The rest of the day was used going back to *Vilnius* at *Kaunas* for some food and shopping.

27/5 The day was used for some tourism visiting the University where we met some girls studying Swedish, looking at churches and climbing the old castle tower admiring the view of the city. On our way to the airport we visited the TV-tower where freedom was won not long ago. In the afternoon our plane left taking us back to *Kristianstad*, Sweden.
