# Emei Shan, Sichuan, China

# 6 March 2005

## General

This was a quick one-day visit and therefore I only covered the lower elevations near town. My main purpose was to look for the seldom-seen Streaked Barwing, which did not succeed. Nevertheless it was a nice day of birding with a number of good flocks moving through. The song activity had not really picked up at this time of the year. Highlights were a large flock of Golden Parrotbills, a few Slaty Buntings, some Red-winged Laughingthrushes and Omei Shan Liocichlas.

#### Itinerary

From Chengdu airport I arranged a car through the travel service desk. The normal taxi price is 350 RMB between Chengdu and Emei, but this was a late Saturday evening so I ended up paying 400 RMB. I stayed at Emei Shan (Grand) Hotel, which I have used before and they offered a room for 252 RMB. This hotel is good and conveniently close to the lower part of the forest near Baoguo Temple.

I birded the area around Fuhu Temple and walked up to between Chunyang and Shenshui, where the habitat started to get too degraded so I returned towards Fuhu. In the afternoon I walked to Hongzhushan, although that area nowadays is very much destroyed by new buildings. Instead I finished the afternoon at Luofeng Nunnery.

By 16.30 I returned to Chengdu by taxi. The drive is around two hours and most of it is on a very quick express road.

## Weather

The weather was dry and with an almost completely clear sky. Temperatures were probably around 10 in the morning and then climbed to around 15-18. At one point I could see the Golden Summit and there was a fair amount of snow there and probably several minus degrees.

#### Birds

Chinese Bamboo-Partridge, Bambusicola thoracica thoracica About three pairs heard. Collared Owlet, Glaucidium brodiei brodiei One heard near Leivin Temple. Asian Barred Owlet, Glaucidium cuculoides whitelyi Two heard at Fuhu Temple. Speckled Piculet, Picumnus innominatus chinensis One or two near Leivin Temple. Barn Swallow, Hirundo rustica ssp A few between Emei and Chengdu. Collared Finchbill, Spizixos semitorques semitorques 15 around Fuhu Temple. Light-vented Bulbul, Pycnonotus sinensis sinensis One near Baoguo Temple. Black Bulbul, Hypsipetes leucocephalus leucothrorax Six at Emei Shan Hotel. Winter Wren, Troglodytes troglodytes szetschuanus One heard near Chunyang Palace. Blue Whistling-Thrush, Myophonus caeruleus caeruleus One at Luofeng Nunnery. Chestnut Thrush, Turdus rubrocanus gouldi Two near Chunyang Palace. Chestnut-headed Tesia, Tesia castaneocoronata castaneocoronata One neat Leivin Temple and one at Luofeng Nunnery. Brownish-flanked Bush-Warbler, Cettia fortipes davidiana A couple of short song-bursts heard of this species. About five unidentified Cettia warblers were seen, perhaps a few being Yellowish-bellied. Buff-barred Warbler, Phylloscopus pulcher pulcher One near Fuhu Temple. Ashy-throated Warbler, Phylloscopus maculipennis maculipennis A few around Hongzhushan. Sichuan Leaf-Warbler, Phylloscopus forresti At least a couple of birds looked like this species at Fuhu Temple. Pallas's Leaf-Warbler, Phylloscopus proregulus 10+, mostly around Fuhu Temple. Seicercus sp One seen at a distance near Fuhu Temple. Chestnut-crowned Warbler, Seicercus castaniceps sinensis About five near Fuhu Temple. Rufous-faced Warbler, Abroscopus albogularis fulvifacies 3-4 near Fuhu Temple. Fujian Niltava, Niltava davidi One male near Luofeng Nunnery.

Plumbeous Water-Redstart, Rhyacornis fuliginosus fuliginosus Two near Fuhu Temple. White-tailed Robin, Cinclidium leucurum leucurum Two heard near Chunyang Palace and two seen near Leivin Temple. White-crowned Forktail, Enicurus leschenaultia sinensis About five scattered individuals. Hwamei, Garrulax canorus canorus About five near Fuhu Temple. Elliot's Laughingthrush, Garrulax elliotii elliotii Two near Chunyang Palace and three near Fuhu Temple. Red-winged Laughingthrush, Garrulax formosus formosus Two near Leivin Temple and two near Fuhu Temple. Omei Shan Liocichla, Liocichla omeiensis Two plus two at Leivin Temple, one near Fuhu Temple and two Baoguo Temple. Spot-breasted Scimitar-Babbler, Pomatorhinus erythrocnemis decarlei One plus one near Fuhu Temple. Streak-breasted Scimitar-Babbler, Pomatorhinus ruficollis eidos 10-20 seen in most areas. Rufous-capped Babbler, Stachyris ruficeps davidi A total of about 20. Red-billed Leiothrix lutea lutea Common. Blue-winged Minla, Minla cyanouroptera wingatei Two near Fuhu Temple. Red-tailed Minla, Minla ignotincta jerdoni A total of about 30. Golden-breasted Fulvetta, Alcippe chrysotis swinhoii Two near Fuhu Temple. Grey-cheeked Fulvetta morrisonia davidi Common. Striated Yuhina, Yuhina castaniceps torqueola Ten near Fuhu Temple. White-collared Yuhina, Yuhina diademata Two near Chunyang Palace. Grey-headed Parrotbill, Paradoxornis gularis fokiensis Five near Chunyang Palace. Ashy-throated Parrotbill, Paradoxornis alphonsianus alphonsianus About ten near Fuhu Temple. Golden Parrotbill, Paradoxornis verreauxi verreauxi One flock of about 50 birds encountered twice. Black-throated Tit, Aegithalos concinnus concinnus A total of about ten. Great Tit, Parus major minor A few around Fuhu Temple. Green-backed Tit, Parus monticolus yunnanensis About 10 near Fuhu Temple.

Yellow-browed Tit, Sylviparus modestus modestus A total of about 15. Long-tailed Shrike, Lanius schach schach One between Emei and Chengdu. Eurasian Jay, Garrulus glandarius sinensis Two near Chunyang Palace. Red-billed Blue Magpie, Urocissa erythrorhyncha erythrorhyncha About five near Chunyang Palace. White-rumped Munia, Lonchura striata swinhoei One near Baoguo Temple. Vinaceous Rosefinch, Carpodacus vinaceus vinaceus Two females at Chunyang Palace and Fuhu Temple. Oriental Greenfinch, Carduelis sinica sinica A few at Hongzhushan. Slaty Bunting, Latoucheornis siemsseni One female and one male respectively between Chunyang Palace and Shenshui Pavilion. Tristram's Bunting, Emberiza tristrami Three near Fuhu Temple. Yellow-throated Bunting, Emberiza elegans ssp Two near Chunyang Palace.
