Happy Island, Hebei, China

17-18 May 2008

General

This was a weekend family trip to this famous migration hot-spot on the coast off Beijing. We also convinced family Nordstrom about the brilliant idea of going, which was helped by Elisabeth being a bit into birding.

Itinerary

On Friday night we drove to the town near the end of the Tanggang expressway. It took 3h15m and upon arrival we checked in at the hotel.

Next morning we set off at 5.00 in order to spend a couple of hours at Little Wood, which is a mere 15 minutes drive. The birding was rather disappointing as there were very few migrants, with only a few warblers and flycatchers as well as a lonely Daurian Starling. By 8.00 we drove to the Weidong Wharf where we rather easily found our boat that would take us to Happy Island. It was very misty and it was even impossible to see the island from the mainland.



The captain navigated through the shallow waters and fish-nets and soon landed us at the jetty on Happy Island. We got some VIP treatment in that the local policemen greeted us with formal salutes and we were swiftly whisked away to our cabins by the electric cars. Being peak season for birding, it was not surprising to find lots of birders around, all of whom gave the same message about the lack of migrants. Anyway, after a quick late brecky, we walked along the sand-dunes (which were much appreciated by the kids) to the southern tip in order to watch waders and gulls. By lunch we were back at the restaurant for some refreshments.



Much of the afternoon was spent around the Temple Wood, where we all enjoyed some birds being mistnetted. Nothing serious in terms of species, but interesting for the kids to see the birds close-up. The evening was spent enjoying our BYO food and drinks (why suffer?).

The Sunday was much the same regarding the migrants, but a fair selection of typical Happy Island stuff was around. Best birds in the mist-nets were Rufous-tailed Robin and Manchurian Reed-Warbler. Elisabeth and I later also walked out along the western mudflats and had some nice wader flocks, before we returned for lunch.

In the early afternoon we packed up and drove to the jetty for the return trip.



Weather

The weather was initially rather misty on the Saturday with a moderate northerly wind. Apparently it was raining in Shandong, so very few birds had made it across the water. During the day it cleared up a bit. On the Sunday it was sunny and clear, but still very few birds around.
