Birding trip to Southern **SHANDONG X** Northern JIANGSU, CHINA

Birding in the Qingdao/Rizhao/Qiansan Island areas. 22-25/1/2010

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INTRODUCTION

Following the success of a pelagic boat trip organised by Zhang Lin (& reported on in the Chinese Journal of Zoology June 2009) from Lianyungang out to the Qiansan Islands, Jiangsu in January 2009 other attempts to do similar pelagic trips were made in the winter of 2009/2010. The January 2009 pelagic trip produced a superbly well photographed Yellow-billed Loon (White-billed Diver) – the first for the province. However the three attempts to organise similar trips the following winter had all failed due to bad weather - this winter had been the coldest in Northern China for over 30 years! Nevertheless Zhang Lin & others remained undaunted and, by watching the weather forecasts carefully, they were optimistic that the weekend of the 23/24 January would provide a window. They were also encouraged by the fact that a local bird photographer, Mr. Li Zhongfeng, had found and photographed a loon on a coastal, tidal lagoon in the centre of Rizhao city in southern Shandong in mid-January 2010. Unsure of its identity hethe photographer had posted some images on the internet and an astute Beijing birder had seen them and realised it was indeed another Yellow-billed Loon.

We recorded a total of 66 species during our short trip including 2 species that are currently considered to be globally threatened by BirdLife International (2004) *Threatened birds of the world* 2004 CD-Rom Cambridge, U.K. BirdLife International. These are indicated in the bird list that follows the daily diary presented below and the codes used are as follows: VU = Vulnerable; NT = Near-threatened. The threatened species were – Saunders's Gull & Relict Gull and both are considered vulnerable (VU). In addition were noted one near threatened species - Ferruginous Pochard.



Friday 22 January 2010. Flew Beijing to Qingdao, Shandong & then drove south to Rizhao.

I flew with Air China from Beijing to Qingdao early on the 22 January. My discounted ticket cost 630 yuan & the one-hour four minute flight left Beijing on time at 07h50 & arrived at Qingdao International Airport just before 09h00. Here I met my friend, Shanghai-based birder Zhang Lin & the two of us headed on our way. We'd missed the 10h00 non-stop express bus from the airport south to Rizhao by only a couple of minutes but the booking staff kindly called the driver's mobile & he came straight back for us! We then headed off, leaving the airport at 10h10, & made extremely rapid progress south down to Rizhao, came off the expressway at 11h55 and were dropped off immediately across the road from our hotel, the Jinjiang Inn, just ten minutes later. Here we met Mr. Li Zhongfeng, the finder of the diver, (<u>xc609@21cn.com</u> mobile – 13963306099) and his local birding buddy, Mr Cheng Subo (<u>cheng_subo@163.com</u> or <u>cheng@yzxh.com</u> mobile – 18606330099). Zhang Lin &me then checked in to the Jinjiang Inn, Rizhao Haiqu Park, No. 77 Haiqu Middle Road, Rizhao, Shandong (tel. 0633-2288808 Fax: 0633-2288809). The

simple but very comfortable, adequately heated rooms (with en suite bathrooms that had a wash basin, shower and western toilet) also all had a TV, kettle & internet access & cost 144 yuan/night.

After just five minutes in our rooms we headed out again with Mr. Li & Mr. Cheng – driving, in their respective vehicles, down to the seafront in central Rizhao. We went straight for lunch in a restaurant overlooking the tidal inlet where Li Zhongfeng had found the diver the previous weekend – though Zhang Lin & me found it difficult to concentrate on lunch as we'd preferred to have been out birding. Nevertheless, after a rather elaborate lunch that Mr. Li treated us to, we headed back out birding and spotted the White-billed Diver within minutes of starting to scan. We then spent the rest of the afternoon watching it and birding the lagoon, along the adjacent coastline and in a small park a very short drive away.

We were also hoping to be able to organise a pelagic boat trip for the following day – perhaps by chartering a fishing boat from Rizhao and trying a pelagic from there. The plan was for Zhang Lin & me to be joined in Rizhao by two other Chinese birding friends - Beijing based birder, and China Daily's Chen Liang, and Wuhan based birder, co-editor of the fabulous China bird report and now WWF staffer, Lei Jinyu. In the event the ever generous, and remarkably well connected, Li Zhongfeng, arranged a boat for us. This would leave from a small fishing harbour about a 45 minutes drive south of Rizhao early the following morning & would take us out to the Qiansan Islands & back.

Weather

According to the cabin announcement it was a chilly -7°C when my plane landed in Qingdao around 09h00 but this had risen to a fairly pleasant (for northern China at the time of year!) plus 4°C besides the Deng Ta Lagoon on Rizhao seafront by 14h10.

Saturday 23 January 2010. All day on a pelagic trip south of Rizhao, Shandong to the Qiansan Islands, Jiangsu.

Lei Jinyu & Chen Liang arrived in Rizhao at 02h00. They'd both caught the last flights of the day from Wuhan & Beijing respectively and had then shared a taxi from Qingdao airport south to Rizhao. Their taxi cost 600 yuan. They then shared a room with Zhang Lin &, unknown to me, headed off to see the Deng Ta Lagoon Yellow-billed Loon early this morning. I expected to meet the three of them in the lobby at 07h00 and was surprised to learn, when I telephoned Zhang Lin, that they were all at the Deng Ta Lagoon! Mr. Li & Mr. Cheng, who were also unaware of their plans, picked me up at the Jinjiang Inn at 07h00 and the three of us, plus a driver, headed down the lagoon to meet the others. The loon was still present and we all watched it for a short while before heading south. We drove south for about 30-40 minutes to Lan Shan Gang (Lan Shan port) – a fairly large and very active fishing port adjacent to a major area of heavy industry and a power station.

Mr. Li had arranged a boat for us - and a very impressive fishing boat that must have been at least 25 metres long was waiting for us when we arrived at Lan Shan fishing harbour. It was perfect for what we wanted – fairly fast (about 20 kilometres/hour according to Zhang Lin's calculations) and very stable – so stable in fact that we were able to use tripod mounted telescopes from its deck! However it was low tide and we were unable to leave the harbour for an hour or so – in the meantime we spent a short while looking at the gulls in the harbour followed by breakfast of seafood noodles in a local restaurant. Mr Li's generosity knew no bounds – not only did he pay for lunch and dinner for Zhang Lin and me on the 22^{nd} , he also paid for this breakfast and dinner for us all on the 23^{rd} . He even paid the 5000 yuan it cost to charter the fishing boat for the entire day! Shandong people are renown for their Confucian generosity but this was truly incredible!

The boat left at 09h26 and we headed out to the Qiansan Islands which are just over 43 kilometres away. We made good progress, the islands became visible at 11h05 (after 100 minutes on the boat & when we were 29 kilometres out from Lan Shan port). We finally arrived at Cheniushan Island, the second largest of the three larger islands at 12h10 & hence the 44.37 kilometre journey took 2 hours and 45 minutes including multiple stops to look at birds on the sea on route. We then spent 1 hour 25 minutes moored at the small quay on Cheniushan Island. This island is inhabited – there's apparently a small military base on it and there's even a mobile phone mast on its summit! The crew had taken some groceries (mostly fresh vegetables) as a gift for the soldiers on the island. Being the only foreigner onboard I was encouraged not to go ashore – other than to stand on the quay. The crew cooked lunch which we ate on the shore. We then re-boarded and took the boat on a tour around the complex of four small islands before heading to another island slightly further north. After circuiting almost completely around that one it was 14h40 & time to head back to the mainland. The trip back took very slightly longer (3 hours & 10 minutes) than the trip out despite the fact that we delayed progress less by looking at fewer birds and also by the fact that the trip back was actually shorter since we were unable to go back to Lan Shan port because the tide was already too low for us to enter the harbour. Instead we docked at an even larger fishing port about eight kilometres south of Lan Shan Gang. From there it took us about 40 minutes to drive back to Rizhao where we had dinner together before checking back in to the Jinjiang Inn.

Weather

A glorious day – very clear with excellent long range visibility, hardly any wind and a virtually flat, calm sea – ideal conditions for our pelagic trip. It was a chilly -4°C outside the Jinjiang Inn in Rizhao at 06h55, this had risen to +3°C on the boat at 10h15, 5°C at 11h15 & a balmy 9°C when we were moored in the Qiansan Islands at 13h35. The temperature dropped quickly once we left the islands and the wind picked up slightly so that its was 0°C at 14h40 & -2°C when we arrived back on the mainland at 17h50.

Sunday 24 January 2010. Day driving north from Rizhao to Jiaonan, Qingdao.

The four of us left the Jinjiang Inn at 07h00 & took a taxi to pick up breakfast items & then on to the Deng Ta Lagoon Yellowbilled Loon. We spent almost two hours there (mostly photographing the main event) before securing another taxi & heading slowly north up Bihai Lu that follows the coast. We made numerous short stops today - mostly at coastal sites where we scanned the sea. At midday we drove back in to town, dropped Chen Liang & Lei Jinyu off at 13h00 when they went on to catch the 13h30 express coach from Rizhao back to Qingdao airport. Zhang Lin & me continued birding throughout the afternoon driving north in to Qingdao county & ended up spending the night in a simple hotel in Jiaonan. Our room for that night cost just 75 yuan/room.

Site 2. Dong Jia Tan, Rizhao. (35°25.95'N., 119°33.19'E.). 09h55-10h10.

This area's a moderately large complex of pools and small reed beds about 400 metres inland and just west of Bihai Lu. It was only a 10-15 minute drive north of the Deng Ta Lagoon. Only a very small part of one of the pools had any open water – everything else was completely frozen. Nevertheless this small pool held an impressive diversity of waterfowl -

Site 6. National Seashore Forest Park, Rizhao. (35°31.01'N., 119°37.22'E.). 12h00-12h30.

We scanned the sea from a small parking lot 500 metres south of the park entrance & pay station. There were quite large numbers of ducks on the sea here. The coastal road, Bihai Lu, ends at the Forest Park and we were forced to back track and head north up route G204. The latter passed further inland and was often well removed from the sea.

Site 7. Dongjiakou Port, Qingdao county. (35°36.61'N., 119°45.76'E.). 14h15-15h10.

This site is well sign posted off route G204 - with the turning being just a four minute drive north of Xinyang zhen. We drove down the old road towards Dongjiakou (a newer one was in the early stages of being constructed about 800 metres further north) and soon saw an impressive looking tidal lagoon off to the right and stopped to investigate it. It was very low tide and many of the birds were too distant – nevertheless it was clearly an important site. This site is near You Tou. Saunders's Gull 129. 108 of these were on the tidal mud flats that we viewed at low tide & the other 21, including just two first winters

Leaving Dongjiakou we headed back to the dual carriageway (route G204) & continued to north towards Qingdao. We came off at Chen Jia Gang and drove between two and three kilometres from there down to the coast at Puwan. We saw very little actually here but from this site we were able to see large numbers of gulls around the next fishing port to the north.

Another decent day – visibility wasn't quite as good as yesterday – but still wasn't at all bad. The day started windier but this mostly abated by the late morning only to pick up again by mid-afternoon. It was a cool $+1^{\circ}$ C outside the Jinjiang Inn in Rizhao at 06h55, this had risen to $+2^{\circ}$ C on the Rizhao seafront just over one hour later. It was still this temperature near Dongjiakou Port in Qingdao county at 14h30.

Monday 25 January 2010. All day Qingdao area, evening flight back to Beijing.

Zhang Lin & me left the guest house at 07h00, flagged a taxi down right outside & then headed out. Once the driver had taken his daughter to school we headed back to the coast and worked our way slowly north up to Huangdao and from there to Hongshiya – both sites that I'd visited on my two previous visits to Shandong (in late December 2002 & early January 2008). We made multiple stops on route – almost all of which were good but the last of which, at Hongshiya Guojia Shiyou Chubeiku, was by far the most productive. From there we headed back to Qingdao airport where I said goodbye to Zhang Lin and checked in for my 18h40 Air China flight back to Beijing. My discounted ticket for this flight was booked & paid for by Qingyu & cost 570 yuan.

Today's taxi from Jiaonan to Huangdao, Hongshiya & on to Qingdao airport cost 500 yuan.

Site 1. Feng He Kou (Feng or literally 'Windy' River Mouth) in Jiaonan. (35°51.29'N, 120°02.38'E). 07h45-10h00.

This site is 36.5 kilometres southwest of Qingdao city.

Jumping out of the taxi on the bridge just 100 metres inland from the river mouth we spent just over two hours birding here. It was low tide & there were decent numbers of ducks and Sanderling immediately upstream from the bridge, an excellent selection of gulls on the beach at the river mouth and a decent assortment of birds on the sea immediately offshore. Once we'd scanned the river mouth we took our taxi along the unpaved coast road accessed by turning right immediately on the northern (Qingdao) side of the bridge. Stopping several times we eventually looped back to the main north-south highway (Km post 116 on route S293) between two and three kilometres further north (35°51.62'N, 120°03.11'E). This northernmost access point is immediately south a large coastal building site - the Sunlight Boao Building Project. The island of Linshan (Lingshan?) was clearly visible well off shore. This island is apparently served by between two and five ferries daily from Jimiya port close to Huangdao and not very far to the north. The first departs at 08h30 and the last boat returns at 15h30 and there are obviously more ferries during the summer tourist season.

Known locally as the Hongshiya Beibu Gongyequ we spent just over one hour there. The mudflats at the mouth of the Cao Wen river were excellent and easily the most bird rich site that we visited today. This site is accessed by turning north off the main east-west road at the western end of Hongshiya. Its sign posted (in English as well as Chinese) to the oil storage depot. Drive down this well made road, pass under a large bridge after about 300 metres and straight down towards the huge oil storage tanks. Turn right immediately before them & drive right to their far end where there's a decent & driveable dirt track off to the left. This leads after about 800 metres to the embankment besides the Cao Wen river. Turn right here and the river mouth is almost one kilometre further on. We first scanned the mud flats from the river mouth but then drove on for about another kilometre until the road became too narrow & tough rough for our low clearance taxi. Being aware that I had a plane to catch we didn't spend any where near as much time at this superb site as it warranted. The tide was rising and the birding excellent with large numbers of gulls (especially Relict & Saunders's), Eurasian Curlews & Eurasian Oystercatchers.

Four figures are given in the first parentheses after the species' English name. The first of these figures details how many days (out of a maximum of 2) that particular species was seen on the trip. The second figure notes the highest daily count & the third the number of bird-days. This latter party were seen particularly well and it contained just one first-winter. Two banded birds adults were also noted – the first had a red band on its lower right leg (it was photographed) while the second adult had a red flag above the knee also on its right leg. This flag was extremely difficult to see being obscured by the bird's belly feathering and could easily have been overlooked in all but the very best of views. Two white characters were inscribed on this red flag the first character was either a 'S' or a 'S' while the second character was definitely 'R' so it either red 'SR' or 'SR' (35°51.62'N, 120°03.11'E). The only other site that any Saunders's Gulls were recorded today was the tidal mudflats near the mouth of the Cao Wen river close to the Huangdao Guojia Shiyou Chubeiku near Hongshiya on the southern side of Jiaozhou Bay, Huangdao (36°07.29'N, 120°06.26'E) where 575 birds were counted on the rising tide. Hundreds if not thousands of other gulls were also present at this site but they were too distant to identify & Its likely that many, many more Saunders's were also present.

RELICT GULL Larus relictus VU 遗鸥

Hundreds if not thousands of other gulls were also present at this site but they were too distant to identify & Its likely that many, many more Relict Gulls were also present.

LONG-BILLED MURRELET Brachyramphus perdix
