<u>Birding in</u> LIAONING

<u>Northeast China</u> <u>5-26 September 2012</u>

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INTRODUCTION

A quick perusal of a map of China suggests that the southern point of the Liaodong Peninsula of Liaoning *must* be an excellent site for witnessing south-bound bird migration. Numerous birds have been seen, and written about, here since the middle of the 19th century (e.g. Swinhoe 1861, Ingram 1909, Seys 1933 and 1936). The area received protection as a National Nature Reserve, the She Dao–Laotie Shan NNR that has a total area 178,073 hectares in 1980 and there have been a series of ringing stations in the reserve for at least a decade, and possibly significantly longer.

However the fact that there is a Chinese naval base in the port city of Lushun (Lüshun or Lvshun) meant that foreigners have not been allowed to visit the southernmost tip of the Liaodong Peninsula for decades (perhaps even since the Communist Party came to power in 1949). This situation changed very recently and foreigners are now allowed back to Lushun and beyond, even right to Laotie Shan, the province's southern tip.

Tom Beeke, a Canadian school teacher based at Jinshitan, was the first to advise (via his regular postings on the BirdForum website <u>http://www.birdforum.net/forumdisplay.php?f=544</u>) of the opening of the Laotie Shan area and he made several visits in autumn 2010. Beijing based British birder Terry Townshend picked up on this and visited Laotie Shan in February 2012 and again, along with Spike Millington, for over a week in mid-May 2012. Terry posted his observations on his excellent blog (<u>http://birdingbeijing.com/</u>) and produced a very useful report at the end of their trip (Townshend and Millington 2012 – see <u>http://birdingbeijing.com/2012/05/23/laotieshan-trip-report/</u>). Terry also enthused about the area and its birds and soon set about organising an autumn visit. I was fortunate enough to visit Laotie Shan together with Terry and Peter Cawley in September-October 2011. Arriving on the 24 September 2012, Terry stayed until the 5 October, Peter until the 7th while I was able to remain until the 16th. We were joined by Tom Beeke for two days (the 1st and 7 October). We had such a superb time that I was keen to visit Laotie Shan again in autumn 2012 and this report details the birds that were seen. I arrived on the 5th September and spent three weeks in the area, Per Alström came out on the 20th and left at the same time as me – on the 25th. Terry arrived on the 22^{nd} and was able to stay a day later than Per and me. Tom Beeke and Stephen Cairns joined me for a day on the 16^{th} September while Leighton (Tian Yang) arrived on the 22^{nd} and birded with us that afternoon and part of the following morning.

This was my sixth visit to Liaoning. I'd previously birded in the province in October 2001 (Holt 2001), January 2008 (Holt and Wang 2008), September-October 2012 (Holt, Townshend and Cawley 2012), January 2012 (Holt and Townshend 2012a) and May 2012 (Holt and Townshend 2012b).

Laotie Shan is 184 kilometres southeast of the well-known migration watch point of Beidaihe in Hebei Province and yet the composition of the birds that occur at these two sites is remarkably different. Observations at Beidaihe have been well documented (see Williams et al. 1992) allowing ready comparisons to be made between there and Laotie Shan. In reality however I fully expected migration through Laotie Shan to be on a larger scale than it is – basically I expected the Liaodong Peninsula to be a much more significant funnel. During the modest amount of time we've spent there in the last two autumns it's become clear that while several species do move through in impressive numbers (with Ashy Minivet being the prime example) many do not and the reason for this is still unclear. Beidaihe has a greater range of habitats than can be found at Laotie Shan (it has a small reservoir and reed bed as well as a series of tidal rivers and extensive mudflats) and it scores better than Laotie Shan for a variety of species including virtually all shorebirds, gulls and terns. Beidaihe's also the preferred route for species that dislike making water crossings and these include quite a few raptors (with the harriers perhaps being the most obvious example), cranes and storks. On the flip side Laotie Shan offers some great seawatching opportunities - though perhaps only early in the season since we saw very, very little over the sea during our 2011 visit. Other species that are well represented at Laotie Shan include Oriental Honey-buzzard, Black Kite, Amur Falcon, Red-rumped Swallow, Black-faced Bunting and house martins. Surprisingly the best conditions for a large raptor movement at Laotie Shan are different at these two site - a strong south-westerly wind is preferred at Laotie Shan while at Beidaihe a north-westerly is best for raptors and north-easterly for other species!

A map of Laotie Shan can be found in Townshend and Millington (2011). The field watch point is about 300 metres from the Light House tourist car park and what is effectively the end of the road (for all but permitted vehicles). Its 400 metres from the turning up to the field watch point to the road junction and bus stop/bus turning point; the small shop is 200 metres back towards Lushun from the bus stop; the small reservoir is about another 500 metres above the shop while the small hotel that Chinese birders occasionally stay at is exactly 1.5 kilometres from the bus terminus. Xiao Dong Gou is another 1.7 kilometres back towards Lushun from that hotel.

for continually supplying information on what he was seeing up at Jinshitan. Thanks also to Tian Yang (Leighton) and to Mr Wang of the Snake Island-Laotie Shan NNR for various assistance while in the area. Mr Sun, and the other staff who we met at the Xiao Dong Gou ringing station, were also very welcoming and helpful.

Wang Qingyu of <u>http://www.chinabirdtour.com</u> booked Paul and Per's domestic flights, all our accommodation in Lushun and even found time to join us for five days. Richard Lewthwaite supplied Paul with a very useful draft of a Liaoning checklist. Thank you all.

ORNITHOLOGICAL HIGHLIGHTS

We recorded a modest 153 species and had such a great time with such excellent birding that it's difficult to single out a small number of highlights. However the following surprised and delighted us -

Five new species for Liaoning with -

- 14 bird-days with up to 11 Short-tailed Shearwaters being noted on four dates between 12-19 September;
- seven bird-days for skuas/jaegers between 12-18 September most were unidentified but a Long-tailed Jaeger was identified on the 12th as was a Pomarine Skua on the 18th;
- a Swinhoe's Minivet on the 14 September;
- a Chestnut-cheeked Starling on 6 September.

High counts included -

- 3274 bird-days for Streaked Shearwater with a count of 1605 during the 4.5 hour sea watch off the point at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 13 September possibly being a Chinese record;
- 4313 bird-days of Oriental Honey-buzzard with 1181 south on the 23 September;
- 938 bird-days of Japanese Sparrowhawk with 446 (possibly a Chinese record) south on the 6 September;
- 16,000 Black-tailed Gulls and 5000 Mongolian Gulls west off the point on the 18 September (possibly both Chinese records);
- 20,959 bird-days of Ashy Minivet with 10,380 on the 21 September (a Chinese record);
- 270 bird-days for Black-naped Oriole with 72 on the 6th & 62 on the 9 September;
- 20,600 bird-days for Barn Swallow with 7500 south on 14 September;
- 56 bird-days for Asian House Martin with 37 south on 6 September;
- 90 Forest Wagtails south on 11 September;
- 3160 bird-days for White Wagtail with 1134 on the 11 September;
- 196 bird-days for Pechora Pipit with exactly half this number, 98 birds, on the 12 September possibly being a Chinese record

Local rarities included:

- single adult Black-legged Kittiwakes on the 12th & 18 September (perhaps the first Chinese records from that month?);
- one juvenile Pallas's Gull during a seawatch on the 18 September perhaps only the sixth record for Liaoning;
- 1 Spotted Nutcracker on the 24 September;

We recorded the following just two Globally Threatened species as defined by BirdLife International. EN = Endangered and VU = Vulnerable and the full details of all these are repeated here -

3 flew west & into Bohai Sea at Laotie Shan, Lushun at 05h47 on the 14/9/2012.

3 flew south at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 9/9/2012.

4 flew south at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 11/9/2012. 3 singles flew south at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 25/9/2012.

We also recorded Japanese Quail a Near Threatened species.

DAILY DIARY

Wednesday 5 September 2012. Flew Beijing to Dalian & drove to Lushun. Afternoon Laotie Shan.

My slightly discounted Air China flight was scheduled to leave Beijing at 08h30 – and it pulled away from the gate right on time, but as now seems the norm at Beijing Capital Airport (the world's second busiest airport), there were delays on the tarmac and we didn't actually take off for another 35 minutes. The flight due east to Dalian towards the southern end of the Liaodong Peninsula took exactly 59 minutes and, once there I jumped straight in a taxi and headed off south to Lushun (= Lvshun = Lüshun). The latter cost 120 yuan (just slightly less than the 130 yuan the hotel staff had told me it would) and it took about 55 minutes to reach the Xin Jiyuan Dajiudian (New Era Grand Hotel) in Lushun. Arriving at 11h20 I checked in, unpacked my gear, dealt with a few emails and headed out again fairly soon afterwards...

My room in this decent three star hotel cost 200 yuan/night (20 less than in September-October 2012 but the reduction was probably due to the fact that I was planning to stay for three solid weeks). My room was OK – fairly, but not very, clean and it had an en suite bathroom with western toilet and shower with 24 hours hot water, a kettle, TV, free internet and two single beds.

I easily secured another taxi on the main highway between the hotel and the naval port and took this to the lighthouse at Laotie Shan. That ride took about 25 minutes, cost 40 yuan and I arrived at 12h57. Once there I spent almost one hour at the watch point a couple of hundred metres before the Lighthouse car park paid before wandering up to the car park itself. I was welcomed almost as an old friend by the three ladies at the ticket booth/drinks stall. As they had done most days in autumn 2012 they waved my 20 yuan entrance fee! After a drink and an ice cream I wandered slowly up the well-paved track through light woodland to the lighthouse. There weren't particularly many birds moving today – a modest trickle of hirundines and one or two raptors. Nevertheless I made fairly quick progress up to the regular lighthouse/coast guard station vantage point. Arriving at about 14h00 I spent just over one hour there before heading slowly back down. I spent about half-an-hour on the trail down towards the beach before returning to the main Lushun road. I could have caught the 16h30 bus back but opted to catch the last one of the day – that at 17h30.

Terry's May 2012 report contains a useful hand-drawn map of the Laotie Shan area, as well as photographs that show the habitat and some scenery.

The small fishing harbour at Chen Jia cun is close to the Lighthouse and the southern tip of the peninsula.

The next village in from the point, and the one close to the first reservoir, is Gang Jia cun.

Probably about the third village in from the point is Xiao Dong Gou and the ringing station that we were granted access to is near here. Note that access to this site must be arranged before visiting – do NOT expected to be welcomed if you turn up uninvited. Mr Wang of the Snake Island Laotie Shan NNR was kind enough to arrange access for us (prompted by Leighton). Mr Wang also gave each of us a copy of an interesting publication on the park - Anon. (2010). *The Avifauna of Liaoning Shedao Laotie Shan NAtture Reserve (1980-2010)*. Liaoning Shedao Laotie Shan NNR Conservation Station. This small book included an annotated checklist of the birds of the park.

About halfway between the end of the road at Laotie Shan and Tieshan zhen is the new settlement of Yang Jia cun. There's a large complex of modern, high-rise apartment buildings here.

Tieshan zhen is the small town where the bus back from Laotie Shan terminates.

Tidal mudflats viewed from the small park besides the Naval Port right on the edge of Lushun.

150 metres up the Lighthouse access road there's a small zoo (with rabbits, peacocks and Golden Pheasants but little else) off to the right. There's a path right through the fenced compound – and this leads out of the back to the lower lighthouse buildings and the sea watching site can also be accessed this way. The main archway in to the Lighthouse compound is another 100 metres further up above the zoo – the gates here aren't always locked but apparently should be from 17h00 - 08h00. Strictly speaking there's only tourist access to the area immediately around the Lighthouse and the two lower platforms where the boundary between Bohai Sea and the yellow sea is a famous tourist attraction.

Note that the Lighthouse apparently stands on the site of a French Longhouse build towards the end of the colonial era in China at the very end of the 19th century.

Lighthouse = Dengta = 灯塔

The areas that we birded were mostly in the She Dao–Laotie Shan National Nature Reserve – a reserve that has a total area 178,073 hectares and was established in 1980 and contains two separate Important Bird Areas (IBA). The relevant paragraphs from BirdLife International (2009) *Directory of Important Bird Areas in China (Mainland): Key Sites for Conservation.* Cambridge, UK: BirdLife International (English language edition) are repeated below -

The first IBA is She Dao (literally 'Snake Island') - IBA no. CN056. CRITERIA: A1 A4i AREA: 73 ha COORDINATES: 38°58'N 120°59'E ALTITUDE: 0-210 m GENERAL DESCRIPTION: She Dao is a small island in the Gulf of Bohai, c.7 nau

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: She Dao is a small island in the Gulf of Bohai, c.7 nautical miles from the mainland, which is located 30 km north-west of Laotie Shan. The island is rocky and hilly with c.70% vegetation cover, and it is famous for its population of vipers [these are apparently Pallas's Pit Vipers].

THREATENED SPECIES: Chinese Egret (VU, 30 pairs were found in the 1980s), Greater Spotted Eagle (VU) CONGREGATORY WATERBIRDS: *Larus crassirostris* (tens of thousands of birds estimated in 1999) IMPORTANCE TO OTHER FAUNA AND FLORA: Snake Island supports an estimated population of 18,000 vipers!

The second IBA is Laotie Shan itself - IBA no. CN058. CRITERIA: A1 A4i AREA: About 17,000 ha COORDINATES: 38°46'N 121°11'E

ALTITUDE: 5-456 m

CONSERVATION STATUS: The IBA is protected within She Dao–Laotie Shan National Nature Reserve (total area 178,073 ha), which was established in 1980.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: Located at the southern tip of the Liaodong Peninsula, west of Port Lüshun, Dalian City. The landscape is typical of the Liaodong Peninsular, hilly with a central lowland area surrounded by higher hills. There are villages, salt pans, rivers and reservoirs, and most of the forest in the IBA is forestry plantation or secondary. This is an important stop-over area for migratory birds, which pass through the IBA in millions annually.

THREATENED SPECIES: Oriental Stork (EN), Japanese Crane (EN), Chinese Egret (VU), Baikal Teal (then VU), Baer's Pochard (VU), Steller's Sea Eagle (VU), Greater Spotted Eagle (VU), Eastern Imperial Eagle (VU), White-naped Crane (VU) and Great Bustard (VU).

CONGREGATORY WATERBIRDS: Chinese Egret (about 100 birds occur on spring and autumn migration) IMPORTANCE TO OTHER FAUNA AND FLORA: No information.

Elsewhere there are reservoirs closer to Dalian – one apparently at Xi Shan and the other at Huangni Chuan, Dalian Nanlu.

Sun rise and sun set at Lushun on 5 Sept. 2012

Weather

A nice day. According to the crew it was 26°C when the plane landed at Dalian airport at about 10h00, this increased slightly as the morning went on and it was 29°C when I arrived at Laotieshan at 13h00 and 28°C most of the time I was at the lighthouse/coast guard station watch point. There was hardly any cloud cover at all today and a modest WNW backing to WSW wind for much of the afternoon.

Common Stonechat Taiga Flycatcher 2 at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 5/9/2012. Eurasian Tree Sparrow 20 at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 5/9/2012. Forest Wagtail 2 separate fly-overs at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 5/9/2012. Eastern Yellow Wagtail 26 at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 5/9/2012. Grey Wagtail 5 at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 5/9/2012. White Wagtail 187 near on the Lushun on the 5/9/2012. About 15 of these, including 8 'Amur Wagtails' M. a. leucopsis, the only ones racially assigned all day, were bus stop area at Laotie Shan while the other 172 flew west over tidal mudflats between Lushun Naval Base & the New Era Grand Hotel between 18h00-18h15 (near dusk). The latter were undoubtedly heading to a nearby roost. Pechora Pipit 1 flew south at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 5/9/2012. Grey-capped Greenfinch 19 at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 5/9/2012. Chinese Grosbeak 18 at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 5/9/2012. Birds were seen in groups of one, five & 12. Black-faced Bunting 1 at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 5/9/2012. bunting sp. 1 at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 5/9/2012.

Thursday 6 September 2012. All day Laotie Shan, Lushun.

My Lushun-based taxi driver, Mr Xing (mobile 13084192682) who Terry, Peter and I used last September-October, arrived on time at 04h45 and the two of us headed straight out. It took us exactly 20 minutes to drive to the watch point that we had visited last autumn. This watch point can be accessed by taking a small, jeep width, but no longer driveable, track off up to the left about 200 metres before the Lighthouse Car Park (Laotie Shan Dengta Ting Che Chang). The best vantage point is about 100 metres up here. Once we arrived I dismissed Mr Xing – having arranged for a similar timed pick up the following morning.

Laotieshan Field Watch Point. (38°43.9'N., 121°08.2'E.).

Note that Laotie Shan light house park doesn't open until 08h00, there's a large fence the main part of it and unfortunately positively no access until that time.

There was lots of visible migration today and I stayed at this site until 09h00 after which I headed in to the Lighthouse complex. I spent much of the rest of the day (09h30-14h10) at the watch point in the Light House/Coast Guard Station compound before going for a short walk down the trail towards the conifers and beach. After an equally brief spell back at the 'field watch point' I caught the 16h30 bus back to the terminus in Tieshan zhen and a taxi from there for the remaining three of four kilometres back to the New Era Grand Hotel in Lushun. The bus took about 20-25 minutes and the taxi another ten or so.

Buses back to Tieshan zhen still leave the turning area on the main road at Laotie Shan at 11h00, 12h40, 14h30, 16h30 and 17h30. It still costs just one yuan/person – but note that no change is given.

Highlights

The undoubted highlight was a juvenile Chestnut-cheeked Starling – apparently the first record for Liaoning (and the northernmost ever Chinese record). Other goodies included good numbers of Japanese Sparrowhawks (446), a Yellow-legged

Buttonquail, 16 White-throated Needletails, 72 Black-naped Orioles, two Northern and 37 Asian House Martins, 56 Forest Wagtails, 73 Chinese Grosbeaks and 14 Yellow-breasted Buntings.

Weather

Another gorgeous day. 22°C outside my hotel in Lushun at 04h40 dropping slightly to 18°C at Laotie Shan half an hour later but soon warming up. It had reached 27°C by 09h45 and hovered between that and 28°C for the rest of the day. There was no cloud cover and it was very calm with little wind pre-dawn, though a light west-south-westerly picked up from about 07h00. Even this had faded by 08h45. As soon as the wind dropped virtually all the birds, even the hirundines, stopped migrating as, shortly afterwards, so did the raptors. No Oriental Honey-buzzards headed out to sea between 09h40 and 11h17. This drop in the wind speed was also linked to a build-up of cloud over the sea. Consequently I left early – taking the 12h40 bus back to Tieshan zhen and then a taxi to Lushun.

<u>Highlights</u>

A few passerines moved south in the early morning and, despite a strengthening south-easterly wind, modest numbers of Pied Harriers (27) and Oriental Honey-buzzards (109) were also moving until about mid-morning. There were also a handful of new trip birds – Chinese Grey Shrike (2), Black Drongo, Yellow-bellied Tit, Baikal Bush Warbler, Daurian Starling (2), Siberian Rubythroat and Dark-sided Flycatcher.

Weather

A decent day. Calm with no wind and 24°C but a slight haze obscuring the moon outside the hotel at 04h40. It was slightly cooler (20°C) at the watch point early morning and with more cloud cover (2/8). Visibility was also slightly poorer than yesterday with Snake Island only just being visible. There was a very light south-easterly breeze and the pressure was stable at 1018 hPa. By 07h00 the cloud cover had increased to about 3/8 and the south-easterly wind had strengthened. The pressure continued to drop slightly (and was 1013 hPa by 11h30) with the south-easterly wind continuing to stiffen throughout the morning. A decent day. Calm with no wind and 4° cooler that yesterday, being just 14° C, at the watch point at 05h15. There was no cloud cover. Visibility was OK – clear up high but poorer at lower levels - also slightly poorer than yesterday with Snake Island not being visible. There was no wind and the pressure was stable at 1015-1016 hPa. After a couple of hours here I headed off to check out the ringing station at Xiao Dong Gou and was lucky in that I managed to hitch a lift of one of the very first vehicles to pass by. It was supposed to be their first day of operation of the ringing station today – and eventually (once the new nets, ropes and other equipment had arrived) I helped chief bander Mr Sun and his boss, Mr Wang Kezhang, set up a few of the nets. I was offered a ride back to Lushun by Mr Wang and several more of his staff and took it.

Highlights

Very few passerines moved south in the early morning but I managed to see a handful of new trip birds – Ruddy Shelduck, a cormorant sp., White-breasted Waterhen, a Heuglin's Gull and a male Red Turtle Dove.

Weather

Another decent day – with no wind, anticyclonic conditions and hence very few birds. At the watch point in the early morning it was calm with no wind, 0/8 cloud cover, the air pressure was 1017 hPa and falling slightly and the temperature 15°C. Visibility was much as yesterday with Snake Island only just being visible. There were patches of light mist and a heavy dew this morning.

Passage had virtually finished by 10h00 and I left the watch point at 10h30 walking slowly back to the bus stop. Taking the 11h00 bus to Xiao Dong Gou I next wandered up to the ringing station – but nothing there – no birds and, more surprisingly, no people. After a brief wander around the woods I headed back to the bus stop and caught the 12h40 back to Tieshan zhen and then a taxi to Lushun.

Highlights

A superb morning of visible passage with large numbers of Forest (90), Eastern Yellow (290), Grey (56) and especially White (1134) Wagtails as well as a few pipits with Richard's (171) and Pechora (38) both being well represented. Other notable birds included both White-throated Needletail and Pacific Swift as well as a couple of Daurian Starling.

Weather

It was a bit milder than the previous few days (22°C) at the watch point. Significantly it was very hazy with was much poorer visibility - I couldn't see more than about four kilometres when I arrived – and even this had dropped to perhaps two kilometres by mid-morning. Low cloud hugged the coastal mountain ridge making the tops of some of the military installation peaks invisible. The pressure was 1015 hPa and initially falling slowly. There was, just as forecast, a light south-south-east wind at dawn and this slowly backed around to the east before easing off with the cloud cover increasing and visibility declining as the wind dropped. By 08h30 there was no wind and visibility was at its worst. It was 26°C and 1016 hPa by 09h00 and by that time visibility was so poor that it was difficult to distinguish the sea from the sky! The wind picked up slightly from about 09h50 and, while variable, was perhaps starting to swing around to the west?

Wednesday 12 September 2012. All day Laotie Shan, Lushun.

I left the Xin Jiyuan Dajiudian, Lushun in Mr Xing's taxi at 04h45 and drove back to the Laotie Shan field watch point. Arriving just over 20 minutes later I spent much of the early morning there. I'd no sooner arrived than a male Von Schrenck's Bittern flew south, coming within five metres of me! A good omen to start the day with!

Not surprisingly it was quieter today than yesterday – but the composition of today's visible migrants more than made up for the reduction in numbers. Today's commonest species was Yellow Wagtail followed, later in the morning by Ashy Minivet, but surprisingly Pechora Pipit was the day's third commonest migrant. In all I logged 98 Pechoras flying purposefully south during the course of the morning.

There were many more gulls out on the sea this morning and, while scanning through them from the watch point, it was easy to see that there were a few Streaked Shearwaters feeding not very far offshore so, when the passerine movement tailed off, as it had by 08h30, I headed down to the far side of the lighthouse for a sea watch. There were still reasonable numbers of Streaked Shearwaters present when I arrived at the designated site. Within three-quarters of an hour an adult Black-legged Kittiwake appeared, an hour later a Short-tailed Shearwater and so it went on. Brilliant and I ended up spending the rest of the morning and all afternoon (09h00-15h30) sea watching!

I left the point at 15h30, spent just over an hour flogging some unproductive bushes and took the 17h30 bus back to Tieshan zhen and then a taxi to Lushun.

Highlights

The early morning passerine movement yielded large numbers of Pechora Pipits – but it was the sea watch that was the day's big event. Short-tailed Shearwater and Long-tailed Jaeger were both new for Liaoning – and Black-legged Kittiwake simply must be rare in China in September. Biggest dip was the first jaeger of the day that I failed to identify – though it was almost certainly not a Long-tailed.

Weather

It rained hard in the middle of the night (at about 01h30) but was dry when I left the hotel – and stayed so until I started to head back at the end of the day. Long range visibility was better than yesterday (presumably due in part to the rain) but still wasn't great being less than four kilometres much of the day. 8/8 cloud cover in the early morning and then 20°C but feeling cooler in the strong wind – and I put a jacket on over my T-shirt and shorts. Pressure remained stable at 1010 hPa all day and was the lowest it'd been in the eight days I've been here. Importantly there was a stiff southerly wind that kept up all day.

The cloud started to clear an hour or so after sunrise and had almost all drifted off north by 07h45. There were a few spots of rain from 16h30 – and a torrential downpour as I'm writing this at just after 21h00.

The turbulent water that is the boundary of the Bohai and Yellow Seas appears to be much rougher than it was at any time during our 2011 visit and is attracting decent numbers of gulls and, today only, shearwaters. The boundary appeared to shift about one kilometre east during the day.

I left the Xin Jiyuan Dajiudian, Lushun in Mr Xing's taxi at 04h45 and drove back to the Laotie Shan field watch point. Arriving just over 20 minutes later I spent a while there – but it was soon pretty obvious that there was more happening out at sea than over the fields. Unfortunately the lighthouse compound doesn't open until at least 08h00 and there was no access to the sea watching point so I had to make do. There was also a reasonable morning passerine flight – but I couldn't do both and opted to concentrate on the seabirds. At 08h30, when I was pretty sure that the lighthouse compound gates would be open, I headed off and wandered down to the best sea watching site. Sadly the bulk of the offshore movement was already well and truly over. Nevertheless I stayed there until 10h30 when I headed off to try and find an alternative vantage point to sea watch from tomorrow.

I left early – taking the 12h40 bus back to Tieshan zhen and then a taxi to the hotel in Lushun. In the late afternoon I headed out again spending a couple of hours (15h00-17h15) close to the hotel. I started by viewing the gulls on the small area tidal mudflats in the naval harbour inlet (apparently called the Nanhai Tou Gongyuan = South Sea Head Park) before walking back towards Laotie Shan and past the Snake Museum to the small fragmites bed and adjacent waste ground.

Highlights

For the second day running sea watching produced the best birds with even more impressive numbers of Streaked Shearwater (1605) than yesterday, another three sightings of Short-tailed Shearwater, another unidentified jaeger and what was most likely a phalarope.

Weather

There was a fairly stiff northerly wind today – exactly the opposite direction to yesterday and there were even more Streaked Shearwaters moving past the point! I'm starting to wonder whether I'd been missing them earlier in the week!

A decent day. After last night's heavy rain today was beautifully clear with perhaps 1/8 cloud cover distantly off to the northeast. Long-range visibility could not have been better – the horizon was sharp and crisp and the Changshan Islands, Shandong were clearly visible for the first time since I'd been at Laotie Shan. It was cool (15° C) with only a light northerly wind blowing when I arrived, The pressure was initially 1011 hPa and this rose very slightly during the day as did the temperature, climbing to 25° C by the time I'd finished sea-watching at 10h30. The northerly wind strengthened fairly quickly and was pretty stiff by 08h30 – this perhaps being the reason that the sea bird passage ended as early as it did.

Friday 14 September 2012. All day Laotie Shan, Lushun.

Mr Xing's was late today and it was almost 05h00 before I left the Xin Jiyuan Dajiudian, Lushun. We drove straight back to Laotie Shan – but for want of change I went to the sea watching site that I'd explored yesterday. This site is accessed by taking the small road down to the abandoned hotel that starts right beside the Light House ticket booth. 30 metres before reaching the derelict hotel there's small shrine down to the right with a track off to the right of it. I took this down to a good vantage point over the sea and Chen Jia cun fishing harbour. Arriving at 05h30 I spent the next 3.5 hours sea watching from here.

After that I headed up to the Lighthouse/Meteorological Station raptor watch point. At one stage I was asked by two staff members to leave – I protested, pleased and claimed not to understand and eventually they bored of me and left me alone! I stayed there until 14h00. As I was leaving I heard a putative Swinhoe's Minivet. Chasing this up I eventually found it – but the views, directly in to the sun were awful and it flew within a couple of seconds of me getting on it. I managed to relocate it and take a few, awful photos, before it flew again. I spent the next few hours searching for it but to no avail. I was frustrated not to have had my recording equipment with me. In fact I spent so long searching for it that I inadvertently missed the last bus back to Tieshan zhen and what's more my mobile phone battery had died. Eventually I managed to blag a ride back in to town from a local gent.

<u>Highlights</u>

The bird of the day, and probably the entire trip was a Swinhoe's Minivet hat eventually preformed pretty well near the Coast Guard station. Highly vocal I managed to record a least a snippet of it calling.

Weather

An unusual, changeable day. Calm with no wind and just 18°C with good visibility but 3/8 cloud cover at 05h30. The pressure was 1019 hPa and still rising and there was a thunderstorm distantly off to the southwest. This storm was clearly approaching and by 07h30 the wind was strong and the pressure dropping rapidly. At about 08h00 there were very strong gusts and many of the fishing boats headed eagerly back to port. This storm lasted for about 30 minutes but didn't yield much rain and rapidly cleared away. The rest of the day was hot, with temperatures soon climbing up to the day's maximum of 26°C, and windless.

Saturday 15 September 2012. All day Laotie Shan, Lushun.

I left the Xin Jiyuan Dajiudian, Lushun in Mr Xing's taxi at 04h45 and drove back to the Laotie Shan field watch point. Arriving just over 20 minutes later I spent three hours there before wandering up to the Coast Guard Station where I spent another 1.5 hours. It was much quieter today and three was very little visible passage so I headed down, caught the 11h00 bus to Xiao Dong Gou and walked from there up to the ringing station. Disappointingly the staff still hadn't erected any more nets since I help put the first five up on the 10th. Mr Sun told me that they were waiting for some finer mesh nets – and that these were on their way! Consequently they weren't catching anything other than smaller raptors – though they did bag eight Japanese Sparrowhawks today. Leaving there at 15h30 I headed back down to the main road and had intended to catch the 16h30 bus back to Tieshan zhen – but I hailed a taxi instead and saved myself a bit of time.

<u>Highlights</u>

Rather little today but two new trip birds - Radde's Warbler (2) and Pallas's Reed Bunting (also 2).

Weather

A glorious day. Calm with no absolutely no wind first thing in the morning and virtually none throughout the entire day – the sea was like a mill pond – and very few of the gulls and virtually none of the Streaked Shearwaters were doing much flying – almost all of them were sitting on the water! It was a shocking 8°C cooler this morning being just 10°C at the watch point at 05h30 but this soon rose and with the sky that remained cloudless all day the temperature rapidly increased. It peaked at 26°C mid-afternoon. Long range visibility was very slightly poorer than yesterday – but the Changshan Islands still being clearly visible. The pressure was rising very slightly it was 1020 hPa at 05h30 and 1022 hPa 2.5 hours later and 1021 hPa back in Lushun at 17h30. There was a light dew and some condensation on the windscreen as we were driving to Laotie Shan.

I left the Xin Jiyuan Dajiudian, Lushun in Mr Xing's taxi at 04h45 and drove back to the Laotie Shan field watch point. Arriving just over 20 minutes later stayed there almost until the mid-afternoon, taking the 14h30 bus back to Tieshan zhen. Tom Beeke and Stephen Cairns arrived at about 06h00 and the three of us spent the day together – the two of them staying on for about another hour after I had left.

The was excellent visible migration in the early morning with large numbers of passerines heading south. Unfortunately most were too high or too distant to identify – but it was impressive to see never the less. The three of us birded around the field watch point until almost 08h30 when we headed up to the Coast Guard Station watch point. We stayed at this latter site until almost 14h00, Tom and Stephen then headed off to bird the coastal gully while I headed down to the bus stop.

<u>Highlights</u>

305 Oriental Honey-buzzards, 1950 Ashy Minivets and 80 Common Rosefinches, all three the highest day counts so far this autumn, headed south; a Yellow Bittern flew past the watch point as did my first Hoopoe of the trip (thanks Tom). Other highlights included an influx of Oriental Turtle Doves (33) and only my second Rufous-bellied Woodpecker of the autumn. Tom and Stephen also saw one of each of the following species - White's Thrush, Pallas's Grasshopper Warbler and Mugimaki Flycatcher.

Weather

There's a fairly week high pressure system centred just to the south of Beijing and an intense low (actually typhoon Sanba that's currently over Okinawa and hence due east of Shanghai). The latter's forecast to continue to track north impacting Jeju, South Korea early on Monday morning while the Beijing high is expected to have weakened and dissipated by then. Laotie Shan's currently midway between the Beijing high and the intense low and we were treated to another glorious day. Calm with only the very lightest of a north to north-westerly winds, 0/8 cloud cover, 1021 hPa and 15°C at the watch point at 05h30.

Visibility was pretty good – though the Chang Shan Islands couldn't be seen. The wind stiffened in the early afternoon and perhaps backed around very slightly towards the west.

As typhoon Sanba tracks northeast across the Korean Peninsula it's forecast to weaken and the winds at Laotie Shan should back slowly further around to the west, they should be due west by Tuesday evening and much of Wednesday with possibly more of south-westerly element by the time Qingyu and Per arrive on Thursday. In autumn 2011 the best raptor passage occurred on south-westerly winds.

Monday 17 September 2012. All day Laotie Shan, Lushun.

I left the Xin Jiyuan Dajiudian, Lushun in a new driver's taxi (Mr Xing was apparently ill) at 04h45 and drove back to the Laotie Shan field watch point. Arriving just over 20 minutes later I spent the rest of the morning there. I stayed at this watch point until 08h30 when I headed up for a two hour sea watch (09h00-11h00). This was followed by another hour besides the Coast Guard Station. After that I headed back to Lushun, went shopping and caught up on my paperwork.

Highlights

A few passerines and Oriental Honey-buzzards moved south in the early morning but a strengthening northerly wind soon put a stop to this. I had two new trip birds – Eurasian Bittern and Common Gull and the other highlight was a leucistic Barn Swallow.

Weather

Another decent, but increasingly windy, day. Calm with just a very light north-north-east wind and 13°C at the field watch point at 05h30. No cloud cover but visibility was also slightly poorer than yesterday with Snake Island only just being visible. Pressure was 1014 hPa and falling. The wind started to stiffen and back around to the north-north-west from 07h15 and one hour later most visible passage had stopped and the first Oriental Honey-buzzards (19 birds) were seen drifting back in off the sea! A few others, perhaps even including these same birds, continued to head south and out to sea until 08h50, but then that was it the day's visible passage had ceased in the strong north-north-west wind.

Tuesday 18 September 2012. All day Laotie Shan, Lushun.

I left the Xin Jiyuan Dajiudian, Lushun, again in Mr. Xing's friend's taxi, at 04h45 and drove back to the Laotie Shan field watch point. Arriving just over 20 minutes later I spent a short while (05h10-06h30) before heading off for a sea watch. After an initial flurry the north-north-westerly wind was apparently keeping many passerines down and the ones that were flying and silent were remarkably difficult to identify in the strong wind. The sea watch was superb – and I ended up spending just over eight hours (06h50-15h00) there before heading back up for a walk around the fields. The latter proved unproductive – it was still essentially too windy and I opted to take the 16h30 bus back to Tieshan zhen.

<u>Highlights</u>

A few passerines moved south in the early morning and, despite the very strong wind modest numbers of Oriental Honeybuzzards (142) were also moving. But it was the sea watch that provided most of the day's entertainment. There were thousands and thousands of gulls, mostly Black-tailed but also about 25% Mongolian, tracking west across the Bay today. This passage started at about 06h00 and continued throughout the morning and well in to the afternoon – in fact it was continuing when I left at 15h00 but by then the light was too bad to make viewing worthwhile – and the reflection of the sun off the surface of the sea was extremely intense. Along with the two commonest species there was also with a smattering of less common species including another adult Black-legged Kittiwake and a gorgeous juvenile Pallas's Gull. Streaked Shearwater numbers continue to drop (I counted 420 today) while, in contrast, I had 11 different sightings of at least two (and quite possibly as many as 11) Short-tailed Shearwaters. Four skuas/jaegers were seen – though only one of them was close enough to confidently identify and it was a juvenile Pomarine Skua.

Weather

Another decent, but very windy day. There was a very strong north-north-west, backing to northwest and later possibly even further wind blowing all day. It was 16°C at the field watch point at 05h30 – but it felt considerably colder in the stiff wind! Just 1/8 cloud cover high off to the Ne but good visibility though the Chang Shan Islands were never visible today. Pressure was 1003 hPa and continuing to fall in the early morning but stable from about 08h00 and slowly rising thereafter.

I left the Xin Jiyuan Dajiudian, Lushun, again in Mr Xing's friend's taxi, at 04h45 and drove back to the Laotie Shan field watch point. Arriving just over 20 minutes later I spent almost three hours (05h10-08h00) there before heading off in to the woodland to check for passerines. It was very, very quiet in there so I decided to wander up to the Lighthouse for more visible migration watching. Eventually I opted to take the 14h30 bus back to Tieshan zhen but ended up being given a lift by someone I'd met earlier inside the tourist area.

Highlights

A few passerines moved south in the early morning as did a modest number of raptors. I also handful of new trip birds with one each of the following five species– Chinese Spot-billed Duck, Upland Buzzard, Bull-headed Shrike, Siberian Thrush and Red Crossbill.

Weather

Another decent day with, unlike yesterday, hardly any wind. There was a barely discernible light northerly blowing in the early morning, this increased ever so slightly late morning but was still light. As a consequence the fishing boats, most of which stayed in the harbour yesterday, were back out in force – and it was noisy! It was 14°C at the field watch point at 05h30, there was a light dew and no cloud during the morning. Low level visibility was rather poor (perhaps less than six or seven kilometres) because of a band of smog. Air pressure was 1009 hPa and stable.

Arriving just over 20 minutes later I spent almost four hours (05h10-09h00) there before heading off up to the Lighthouse for more visible migration watching. I spent much of the rest of the day there (09h20-13h30) before heading back down to the car park to meet WANG Qingyu and Per Alström. Per and Qingyu had flown in from Beijing earlier in the day and we were to spend the following five days birding together. The three of us then took their taxi back to Xiao Dong Gou

before walking up to the ringing station. Here we met Mr Sun and later his boss, Wang Xiaoping. After about one hour there Mr Wang gave us a ride back to our hotel in the late afternoon.

Highlights

A few passerines moved south in the early morning as did a modest number of raptors. I also had three new trip birds today with four sightings of single Eastern Buzzards at the point and a Northern Hawk-cuckoo being the first bird produced from a ringing bag at the Xiao Dong Gou ringing station and two Oriental Scops Owls being the second and third!

Weather

Another decent day with hardly any wind. There was a barely discernible light south-south-easterly first thing in the morning though this veered around to being a south-westerly within an hour-and-a-half and remained that way for most of the day. It remained light throughout. It was 15°C at the field watch point at 05h30 and with no cloud all day. Low level visibility was very poor – and worsened throughout the day so much so that it was probably down to less than three kilometres by the early afternoon. Away from the Laotie Shan point, even a little bit as at Xiao Dong Gou, visibility was markedly better. Air pressure was 1015 hPa and had been stable throughout the night but soon started to rise. It was 1017 hPa by 09h00. The temperature had risen to 25°C by 09h30 and peaked at 29°C by 12h00.

After ice creams down near the ticket booth the three of us took a taxi back to Xiao Dong Gou before walking up to the ringing station. Here we met Mr Sun and later Zhang Bin. After about 1.5 hours there Zhang Bin gave us a ride back to our hotel, where we arrived just before 16h00.

Highlights

Massive numbers of passerines, especially Ashy Minivets (10,380) moved south in the early morning and there were also modest numbers of Oriental Honey-buzzards (446) and the first decent numbers of Black Kite (34) for the autumn.

Weather

Another reasonable day – but with poor visibility until the mid-afternoon. There was a light southerly wind first thing in the morning, this increased in strength from about 07h00 and gradually backed around to the southeast as the morning progressed. It was slightly warmer than yesterday $(17^{\circ}C)$ at the field watch point at 05h30 and with rather little cloud early in the day – but an increasing amount as the morning wore on. Like yesterday low level visibility was very poor until the early afternoon when the wind picked up. Air pressure was 1015 hPa and had been stable throughout the night but it started to drop slowly in the late morning. The temperature had risen to $27^{\circ}C$ by 11h30.

Terry had arrived at about 01h00 and he, Per and I left the Xin Jiyuan Dajjudian, Lushun, again in Mr Xing's friend's taxi, at 04h45. We drove straight back to the Laotie Shan field watch point. Arriving just over 20 minutes later we spent just over 1.5 hours (05h10-06h45) there before heading off down to the sea watching site. This also proved to be pretty quiet and by then the weather was so awful that we called Qingyu, who was enjoying a more leisurely breakfast back in Lushun. We asked her to send a taxi to come and pick us up. This she did and, as Leighton (Tian Yang) was scheduled to arrive about 10 minutes later, we lingered there and waited for him. We chatted with Leighton for a short while before he invited us back to his hotel to meet ace Chinese bird photographer, ZHANG Ming (email Inpj3yzm@163.com & websites www.pjbw.org. www.birdnet.cn) and some of Mr Zhang's friends. Zhang Ming told us, among many other things, about a small marsh in Dalian where a friend of his had seen Asian Yellow Rail and Band-bellied Crake three days earlier - and with little persuasion he offered to guide us up there. Setting off in a three car convoy shortly afterwards. Per, Terry and I travelled with Leighton and Wang Xiaoping while Qingyu rode with Zhang Ming. We stopped for lunch on route and the marsh itself proved quite difficult to find. Once there were also failed to find either of the target species and ended up leaving at 17h00 to drive back in to Dalian for another massive meal! We eventually arrived back at our hotel just after 21h00.

Weather

Today's forecast of heavy rain was correct. It apparently started, as a thunderstorm, at about 02h30 and it rained hard until 04h15, there was then a brief respite before the heavens opened again at about 06h30. This downpour lasted the rest of the morning and forced an early departure from Laotie Shan. Fortunately it stopped raining about midday and the afternoon was much better with a modest southeast wind, fairly clear skies and what looked, to us, like great migration conditions. During our rail raid we couldn't help wondering what migration was like back at the point. There was a very light easterly wind in the early morning though this strengthened as soon as it stopped raining mid-morning. It was 17°C at the field watch point at 05h30 but was fully over cast. The pressure then was 1014 hPa and stable.

We spent much of the rest of the day there (09h30-15h00), though Per who wasn't feeling particularly well, returned to the hotel in the late morning. Qingyu arrived shortly after Per had left. Qingyu and Paul left on the 16h30 bus back to Tieshan zhen while Terry returned to the Coast Guard station/Light House area for another hour.

Highlights

Very few passerines moved south in the early morning but good numbers of raptors were moving. High counts included those of Oriental Honey-buzzard (1181) and Eurasian Sparrowhawk (73).

Weather

Another reasonable day – but with rather poor visibility throughout the day. There was a very light mist and a light southeasterly wind and in the early morning though the wind had shifted around to the southwest by 08h15. It was slightly cooler than yesterday (14°C) at the field watch point at 05h30 and with hardly any cloud early in the day. Like yesterday and the day before low level visibility was poor. Air pressure was 1013 hPa and falling slowly. The temperature had risen to 24°C by 13h30.

We spent the rest of the morning (09h30-12h30) there and left the point in the early afternoon. Terry returned to the hotel to do some work while, Per, Qingyu and I went to the Xiao Dong Gou ringing station. We spent little over half-an-hour here before Mr Wang kindly gave us a ride back to our hotel. We arrived back at about 16h00 and the four of us went to dinner in town at about 18h30.

Highlights

Rather few passerines moved south in the early morning but there were a few surprises – six small, and unidentified, herons flew out when it was still dark in the early morning. Other surprises included an unidentified small auklet on the sea off the point and a Spotted Nutcracker (Paul's 300th Liaoning species) that flew south as far as the point before later returning north. There was also a modest movement of Oriental Honey-buzzard (253) and the first decent tally of White-cheeked Starlings (90).

Weather

Another reasonable day – but with rather poor visibility throughout the day. There was a moderate north-north-easterly wind and in the early morning. It was slightly warmer than yesterday $(16^{\circ}C)$ at the field watch point at 05h30 and with no cloud early in the day. Like the previous three days low level visibility was very poor. Air pressure was 1016 hPa. By 06h00 there were a few high clouds starting to drift in from the north. The temperature had risen to 28°C by 11h30.

Tuesday 25 September 2012. All day Laotie Shan, Lushun.

Terry, Per and I left the Xin Jiyuan Dajiudian, Lushun, again in Mr Xing's friend's taxi, at 04h45. We drove straight back to the Laotie Shan field watch point. Arriving just over 20 minutes later we spent almost four hours (05h10-09h00) there before heading up to the Coast Guard station/Light House area. We spent the rest of the morning there (09h30-12h30), and left in the early afternoon. We all returned to the hotel. Per, Qingyu and I checked out and headed back to Dalian airport. Per and Qingyu had an on time Air China flight from there back to Beijing while my flight, with China Southern, was delayed.

Highlights

There was a very impressive movement of passerines in the early morning. The movement was on a very broad front and most birds went unidentified (I logged 3000 passerine sp. but they weren't specifically counted and this number is undoubtedly conservative). Nevertheless quite a few birds were identified and high counts included – 759 Olive-backed Pipits and 400+ bunting sp. There was also a reasonable movement of raptors with Oriental Honey-buzzard (267) and Japanese Sparrowhawk (87) both being well represented.

There were a few surprises – with several species (Bean Goose sp., Purple Heron, Pallas's Leaf Warbler, Buff-bellied Pipit and Brambling) appearing for the first time and all bar the heron were probably quite early autumn records.

Weather

Another reasonable day –visibility had improved on the previous three days but was still disappointingly poor. It was particularly bad off to the west in the early morning but worsened throughout as the morning wore on. There was just 1/8 cloud cover before dawn and a very light northeast wind. The wind slowly backed around through north - by 08h30 it was north-westerly while an hour later it had stiffened considerably and was from the south-south-east. The sky was very clear in the early morning with large numbers of stars being seen for the first time in several days. With the clearer sky it was also slightly cooler than yesterday (14°C) at the field watch point at 05h30 and this had risen to 19°C by 07h15. The air pressure was 1019 hPa and stable. As the wind shifted around to the south-south-east visibility worsened – and was soon down to perhaps as little as four or five kilometres.

Sunrise was at 05h51 today.

Wednesday 26 September 2012. Terry stayed on & spent all day Laotie Shan, Lushun.

The day started, as usual, at 04h45 with Terry taking a taxi from the hotel to the point. I spent most of the day at Laotieshan, catching the 16h30 bus back to the village and on to the hotel before checking out and taking a taxi to the airport for my late flight to Beijing.

The day began with a big sigh. Just as my taxi left me at the point at 05h15, I realised I had left my binoculars in my hotel room...! I had never done this before and I was fuming with myself. Without any means to return to collect them until lunchtime (there are no taxis at the point and the first bus back is at 11h00), I realised that I would need to learn to bird with just my scope and camera... Although I undoubtedly missed out on identifying a few flyover passerines, I don't think it handicapped me *too much*, although many times I instinctively reached for my absent binoculars when an interesting bird appeared...

I spent the first 3 hours at the usual watch point along the trail close to the lighthouse. There was impressive hirundine migration (mostly Red-rumped Swallows) early on but, after a heavy shower passed around 0830, visible migration almost ceased. At this point I did a brief seawatch, seeing several Streaked Shearwaters and a good number of gulls, before moving to the lighthouse compound. Here, there were many birds. There had been a fall of *phylloscopus* warblers with many Yellow-browed, Radde's and Dusky Warblers and Asian Stubtails. I spent the next 4-5 hours at the lighthouse compound and enjoyed some new birds for the trip. I tried the trails close to the lighthouse but these were strangely quiet. The density of birds was seemingly limited to the lighthouse compound. A call to the ringing station revealed that they had caught 3 Oriental Scops Owls early morning but had already released them and there were apparently no passerines in the nets.

Weather

Overcast, relatively warm (I estimated around 18°C at 05h15) and with a light wind from the south, which continued and, if anything, dropped as the day wore on. Visibility was poor and worsened, limited to 2-3 km in the afternoon. After a clear beginning to the previous night, cloud cover increased overnight and there were some showers in the early morning before dawn.

The highest number of birds that were in view at any one time was about 65 in the early morning with a similar number again between 14h30 & 15h00.
- 1605 during the 4.5 hour sea watch off the point at Laotie Shan, Lushun on the 13/9/2012. Just like yesterday almost all of these were seen flying west and in to Bohai Sea (the small number, less than ten in total, that went in the opposite direction were subtracted from the final tally). It's impossible to know if this involved one bird or as many as three different individuals but my guess would be the latter. The first record for Liaoning.

All encounters were with birds flying west past the headland and in to Bohai Sea with the first sighting being at 07h19, the second at 07h59 & the third at 09h42. Also just like yesterday It's impossible to know if this involved one bird or as many as three different individuals.

Honey-buzzard migration at Laotie Shan undoubtedly commences in late August, as it does in Beijing, but it is the last week of September before the peak occurs. Tom Beeke's 'big Oriental Honey-buzzard day' at Laotie Shan in 2010 was on the 27 September while our largest count in 2011 was of 1035 on our very first day on site, the 24 September. This year's highest count was on a very similar scale and at a very similar time – 1181 birds on the 23 September. Rather few birds are seen after the end of the first week of October – but birds probably continue to trickle through at least until the third week of that month.

Several Oriental Honey-buzzards have been fitted with satellite trackers and their migration routes monitored – see http://hachi.sfc.keio.ac.jp/home_e.html

The first birds (four) were seen at 05h32 and within the following half-hour period total of 68 birds headed south and out over the sea. 446 were counted heading south in the first 3.5 hours but passage stopped with the strengthening of the north-north-west wind. Subsequently modest numbers of birds (46) were seen heading back in off the sea in the late morning (11h00-12h00). Surprisingly the latter were actually coming in from very high up & almost from directly due east!

Large numbers of Pied Harriers in particular have been observed passing Beidaihe, Hebei in the first week of September (see Williams 2004)
