Birding trip to SHANDONG, CHINA

Birding in the Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng, Penglai, Changdao & Yantai areas 11-22/10/2010

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INTRODUCTION

In mid-October 2010 I made a 12 day birding trip to Shandong Province, eastern China. Even though I only recorded a modest 123 species the trip proved to be very interesting, great fun and thoroughly enjoyable. Highlights included small numbers of Streaked Shearwaters from the ferry between Shandong & Liaoning; up to 17 Pelagic Cormorants on Changdao; modest numbers of migrating raptors including 16 Northern Goshawks, 796 Eastern Buzzards and 115 Amur Falcons over Changdao; an adult Long-tailed Jaeger from the Penglai to Changdao ferry; a single Bearded Reedling, four different Manchurian Bush Warblers and a Marsh Grassbird on Changdao where day counts of over 5000 Bramblings, 13 Yellow-browed, 375 Black-faced and six Ochrerumped Buntings were also made.

The logistics for the trip were again organised by Wang Qingyu – the ground agent that I use for all of the Sunbird/Wings tours that I lead in China. Qingyu even accompanied me for a large portion of the trip & I have absolutely no hesitation in recommending her as a ground agent. She can be contacted at -

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Monday 11 October 2010. Flew Beijing to Yantai, Shandong & then drove east to Rongcheng.

Qingyu & me left Tongzhou at 05h00 & drove to Beijing Capital International Airport where our Air China flight from Beijing to Yantai (CA1585) left the gate on time at 07h50. Our discounted one-way tickets cost 740 yuan & we arrived at Yantai's Laishan International Airport at 09h04 after a one-hour four minute flight. Once we'd reclaimed our luggage we took an airport bus to the main bus station (Chiche Zhong Zhan) in central Yantai where we caught another bus to Weihai. The latter leave every 15 minutes and tickets cost 25/person. The drive took just over 1.5 hours, we stayed on until the terminus at Weihai Xin Chiche Zhan (Weihai New Bus Station) – right next to the city's main railway station. From there we chartered a taxi from Mrs. Yu (mobile 15898972671) & she charged 260 yuan to stay with us for the half-day & take us from Weihai via Tian'e Hu to Cheng Shan Tou. This seemed a reasonable price.

Unfortunately we realised too late and should have flown from Beijing to Weihai instead of Beijing to Yantai – the tickets to Weihai were cheaper at 570 yuan/person and we were then closer to our destination. Note however that while there were six flights from Beijing to Yantai everyday there are only three daily flights from Beijing to Weihai!

The drive from Yantai to Weihai & beyond was fairly interesting – but largely bird less! All of the route between the two cities was on expressway during which time we passed a couple of small areas of salt pans, large expanses of fishponds and a few tracts of fairly recently planted conifer shelter belts. We also crossed several small rivers and drainage channels but even these didn't hold many birds! Yantai is apparently a major wine producing region while between Weihai and the north-eastern point of the Shandong Peninsula there were more areas of apple orchard and more stands of maize.

Site 1. Tian'e Hu (Swan Lake), Rongcheng. (37°21.58'N., 122°34.80'E.). 13h15-13h44.

This very disappointing site was a medium sized lake (perhaps 1.5-2 kilometres in diameter) but was fringed by a wall or concrete for almost one-third of its circumference. It had several speed boats (fortunately none of which were being used today) on it & had a new housing complex nearing completion just 80 metres from the shoreline! We weren't surprised that it held rather few birds –

Site 2. Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng. (37°23.35'N., 122°41.79'E.). 14h10-17h10.

We spent three hours seawatching here. Undoubtedly the best site to do this is the tourist complex at the very end of Cheng Shan Tou – but access to this spot costs a ridiculous 150 yuan/person/visit! I was reluctant to pay this amount & opted instead to view from the rear of the Hai Yang Huanjing Jiance Zhan (Sea Quality Monitoring Station).

When arriving at Cheng Shan Tou from Weihai route 302 passes through the fishing harbour of Cheng Shan zhen and then starts to climb up a slight hill with the sea off to the right. Near the crest there's a large Forbidden City-like building with a triple archway that the road passes through. What's apparently the main car park serving Cheng Shan Tou is on the other side of this archway and the three storey Hai Yang Huanjing Jiance Zhan (Sea Quality Monitoring Station) building is set back about 150 metres to the right (southwest). It looks private but the staff were friendly and allowed us access. At the rear there's a series of flag poles and then some steps leading down the cliffs. We wandered about half-way down these before clambering over the small wall and sitting down at a decent vantage point. During the several visits I made to this site quite a few Chinese tourists also wandered down to where I was sea watching – so this site clearly isn't off limits.

According to Zhang Lin some Shanghai birders had done a pelagic trip out of Lianyungang during the autumn National Day holiday in the first week of October 2010. They hadn't seen very much during the pelagic – but did see two Streaked Shearwaters from a shore-based seawatch & I was hoping to encounter something similar during my time sea watching. I didn't!

Other than a constant southerly passage of members of the 'Herring Gull Assemblage' and a modest number of Black-tailed Gulls drifting around we saw rather little – an adult Eastern Buzzard came in off the sea mid-afternoon but there were no ducks, grebes of even curlews passing. Nevertheless watching the migrating gulls was interesting.

Shanghai birder Zhang Lin had birded this site for one day in April 2009 – he'd had an excellent time and had seen some decent passerine migration and a single Oriental Stork but little in the way of seabird passage.

I left the seawatch site at 17h10. There were numerous guest houses nearby & Qingyu had left earlier than me and found us a simple guest house – the family run Haowangjiao Yujiale ('Land's End Local Guest House'). Run by Mrs. Wang Luyan (mobile 13963110885) low season rooms cost 80 yuan/person. The price included a delicious seafood dinner. In the tourist season the same guest house will charge 180 yuan/person. None of the simple rooms had en suite facilities – though there was a hot water shower in the main building and a continental, hole in the floor style toilet across the small, private courtyard.

Weather

After three days of extremely poor visibility in Beijing it had rained over night and we left the Capital on what was turning out to be a gorgeous autumn day with fabulous long-range visibility. Visibility wasn't quite as good as this in Shandong – but it wasn't bad. According to the airline cabin announcement it was 19°C when landed in Yantai at 09h00. this had risen to a fairly pleasant 22°C close to the sea at Tian'e Hu by 13h30 & 21°C at Cheng Shan Tou by 15h30.

Tuesday 12 October 2010. All day Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng.

I left the Haowangjiao Yujiale guest house at 05h15 & walked back to the sea quality monitoring station seawatch point. I birded there from 05h40 (official sunrise) until 08h30 when I went for a short walk looking for passerines in the neighbouring gardens and coastal scrub. Qingyu joined me at about 09h15 & the two of us then headed north to the park entrance. I duly paid my 150 yuan, we climbed aboard a park shuttle bus and headed on in. The bus stopped after about one kilometre – we both clambered off and walked from there about another 1.3 kilometres to the main headland and tourist complex surrounding the lighthouse. We did another seawatch there – but things were very quiet today. We gave that up in the early afternoon, walked north back to the main entrance & birded around that area until the late afternoon. We walked about 500 metres west of the park ticket office and had another short seawatch at a site where Hailu Dao ('Sea Donkey Island') was clearly visible about three kilometres to the north. This island has a small ferry service and simple accommodation on it – but its only open during the popular tourist season i.e. the summer months. We could see that this small, steep sided island had considerable cover on it – with short, stunted trees as well as lots of bushes and scrub. Its undoubtedly a decent migrant trap during the correct season (and possibly also has breeding seabirds and perhaps even breeding Styan's Grasshopper Warblers on it?)

I was surprised to learn subsequently that Hailu Dao is listed as an Important Bird Area (IBA CN330) by BirdLife International (2009) *Directory of Important Bird Areas in China (Mainland): Key Sites for Conservation*. Cambridge, UK: BirdLife International (English language edition). According to that publication Hailü Dao (37°27'N 122°40'E) is currently unprotected, covers just 7 hectares, ranges from sea level up to 66 metres & is an important breeding ground for gulls. The only Globally Threatened noted for the island by the same publication is Chinese Egret *Egretta eulophotes* (VU). Its clearly being developed more for tourism than a protected wildlife site!

Site 1. Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng. (37°23.35'N., 122°41.79'E.). 05h40 intermittently until 16h30

Weather

It was almost totally overcast and windy when I left the guest house at 05h15. The cloud cover broke up quite quickly once the sun had risen and there was very little cloud cover by 08h30. At the same time however the wind strengthened and by 08h30 there was a very strong north-westerly blowing. This continued to strengthen and backed around to become west-north-westerly by midday but this had veered back to become northerly by the later afternoon. By 16h30 much of the wind had abated and it was a very clear, cloudless night. The pressure rose slightly in the early morning from about 1019 hPa to 1021 but gradually dropped back down to 1018 during the late afternoon. It was again 1019 hPa by 19h30.

Highlights of the day

There were far, far fewer birds moving over the sea today and no genuine movement of gulls at all (just as many, if not more, gulls were flying north as were going south). I saw a few waterfowl – but still no cormorants and, for the second day running, not even a single Black-headed Gull!

The later two were probably in the process of migrating. 6 on floating pontoons in the main harbour north of Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. Little Egret 3 singles around Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. Common Kestrel Amur Falcon 3 around Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. Two were seen from the sea quality monitoring station right at sunrise (& had probably roosted on the adjacent cliffs overnight) while another flew south offshore at 11h15. 1 flew south off Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. Merlin Peregrine Falcon 2, a pair of adults, were seen repeatedly off Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. Whimbrel 1 flew north off the sea quality monitoring station at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng at 06h12 on the 12/10/2010. Black-tailed Gull 74 off Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. There was no obvious passage all day - and incredibly 74 birds were logged flying north and 73 flying south! 'Herring Gull Assemblage' 348 off Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. As with Black-tailed Gull, & in total contrast to yesterday, there was no obvious passage all day with 348 birds being logged drifting north & just 46 heading south. Heuglin's Gull 3 were logged flying north off Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng in the later afternoon on the 12/10/2010. 3 were logged flying north off Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng around midday on the 12/10/2010. Mongolian Gull Oriental Turtle Dove 6 at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. Three of these were singles that were seen coming in off the sea in the early morning. Spotted Dove 1 at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. 2 singles at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. The first was near the sea quality monitoring station & Common Kingfisher the second flew across the road just inside the tourist park complex. Ashy Minivet 3 singles at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. The first birds flew south over the sea quality monitoring station at 06h16 & 06h39 respectively. Common Magpie 50 in the Cheng Shan Tou area, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. 4 were heard in & around Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. Japanese Tit 21 came in off the sea at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. Eurasian Skylark 8 at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. Light-vented Bulbul Sand Martin 1 flew south at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. 1250 flew south at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. Wednesday 13 October 2010. Morning Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng. Late pm Changdao, Penglai.

I left the Haowangjiao Yujiale guest house at 05h00 & walked back to the sea quality monitoring station seawatch point. Arriving at 05h25 I birded there from about 15 minutes before official sunrise) until 07h30 when I slowly headed back to the guest house.

Once back at the guest house I had breakfast before we left at 09h00. There's a regular half-hourly bus service from Chang Shan Tou to Weihai. The first pick up is right outside the Haowangjiao Yujiale guest house and the charge is 15 yuan/person. The bus was rather knackered, was completely full for much of the journey, made numerous stops and took almost twice as long (one hour & 40 minutes) as a taxi would have.

We arrived back at Weihai bus station at 10h40 and immediately bought tickets for the 11h30 coach to Yantai. These cost 28 yuan/person and the trip back took 1 hour 50 minutes. There's a KFC restaurant across the road from the bus station in Weihai.

There were about 300 large gulls loafing on the beach about 200 metres north of the G12 expressway about 500 metres west of the CCTV coastal film set & not far east of the Wendeng / Beihai exit off the expressway. This site was about a 50 minute coach ride west of Weihai (& about one hour east of Yantai).

We arrived back in Yantai at 13h26 & took the very next coach west to Penglai (these run every 20 minutes, also take about 1.5 hours & tickets for that coach cost 28 yuan/person). Our coach left at 13h50 & a lot of the 70 or 80 kilometre journey from Yantai to Penglai is on high speed expressway with the route going past several extensive vineyards & past a massive shipyard one hour out. We arrived at the Penglai bus terminus at 15h20 & there's also a KFC restaurant across the road from the bus station there as well!

We bought a map of the Penglai area and took a taxi from the bus station for 5 minutes down to the ferry terminal (this cost 7 yuan - the minimum fare). The ferry terminal is also right next to a large aquarium complex. Arriving at the harbour at 15h25 we'd just missed being able to purchase tickets for the 15h30 car ferry across to Changdao. In the event this large ferry didn't leave until 15h40! There's quite a variety of boats plying the nine or ten kilometre crossing from Penglai to Changdao – the large car ferry takes one hour while the small, high speed boat that Qingyu bought us tickets for probably seats no more than 60 people but takes just 30 minutes. Unfortunately most of this boat is enclosed & there's only enough room for about ten people to stand outside at the very back. It was also so quick that, had the sea been rough, it would have been impossible to use binoculars. For birders I would think that the slow but stable car ferry is the best choice. Our tickets for the fast 30 minute passenger-only ferry coast 23 yuan each.

Penglai taxi driver Mr. Zhao Xing (mobile - 13853515618). He quoted 200 yuan for a taxi ride from the ferry terminal at Penglai to Yantai airport. Mr. Fan on Changdao told us that this shouldn't cost more than 100 yuan.

Changdao taxi driver Mr. Fan (mobile - 13963821530)

There are just two directed buses from Weihai to Penglai (at 08h30 & 13h00) but its undoubtedly much faster to go via an extra change in Yantai.

Ferries from Penglai to Changdao run every 30 minutes – the fast, non-vehicle ferries take just 30 minutes, the others closer to one hour. The ferries apparently run between the hours of 06h30 & 17h30.

There's lots of accommodation on Changdao – with a huge price range from simple, cheap guest houses to an expensive (700 yuan/room/night) 4-star hotel. We spent our first night on the island in the Changdao Shiji Jiari Hotel area ('Century Holiday Hotel') close to the northernmost point on Changdao. Our room here cost 120 yuan/night but there were hardly any other guests and while the staff were friendly, and the rooms OK it initially felt a bit too far out. Lots of taxis were available around the ferry terminus and harbour in Changdao town – but none were present anywhere near the hotel – though the staff did tell us that they would be able to telephone and order one. Each room had an en suite bathroom with western toilet, wash basin and a shower. The latter had individual hot water heaters & hence 24 hours hot water! The restaurant was deserted and the range of dishes available small. After several days on the island however I realised that this hotel was undoubtedly the best one for a birder to be based at.

Weather

It was a glorious day today with conditions remaining anticyclonic. There was about 3/8 cloud cover at Cheng Shan Tou before dawn, though the cloud burnt off very quickly once the sun had risen. There was hardly any wind first thing in the morning and the pressure varied from 1017-1019 hPa all day. It was 14°C & 16°C at Cheng Shan Tou at 05h30 & 07h05 respectively & 20 in Penglai harbour at 16h00.

Incredibly none were ever seen from the seawatches at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng! 87 in northern Shandong on the 13/10/2010. 77 of these were seen moving north during the two hour morning seawatch at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng while another ten were in Penglai harbour in the late afternoon. 665 in northern Shandong on the 13/10/2010. 650 of these were seen moving north during the two hour morning seawatch at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng while another 15 were seen from the ferry between Penglai & Changdao in the late afternoon. I left the Changdao Shiji Jiari Hotel ('Century Holiday Hotel') at 05h10 & walked about 400 metres down to the beach at Moon Bay. I spent the early morning there – walking about another 400 metres north up the rocky beach to a coastal vantage point just north of the first series of buildings. There were decent numbers of passerines (mostly Eurasian Skylarks) coming in off the sea & I spent the first two hours of sunlight watching these. Qingyu joined me at about 08h00 and the two of us soon returned to the hotel. Mr. Fan, our taxi driver, arrived at 0840 and we spent the rest of the day exploring a handful of sites on Changdao.

There's a large military community on the islands & Changdao has only recently been opened to foreigners. Foreigners are still only allowed to visit three of the islands and absolutely cannot go to Daheishan Dao. The latter has a sizeable hill on it, probably stands higher than the other islands in the area and is presumably more visible to migrating birds. Its reportedly the best island for birds and there's an active bird observatory & bird banding station on it. A reasonable number of Chinese birders, especially bird photographers, go to Daheishan Dao every year – especially during the first week of October National Day annual holiday when

large numbers of migrant raptors are often recorded. Oriental Honey-buzzards, on route to being shot in Guangxi, are a key feature of the raptor migration at Daheishan Dao in mid-late September. The Changdao Islands, right at the junction of the Yellow Sea & Bohai Bay, are right on the flight line of birds heading south down the Liaodong peninsula, over the equally important migration watch point of Laotieshan near Dalian & Lushun (where foreigners also aren't allowed to visit!) & south in to Shandong and on through mainland China.

Changdao Nature Reserve was recognised as an Important Bird Area (IBA CN329) by BirdLife International (2009) in their *Directory of Important Bird Areas in China (Mainland): Key Sites for Conservation.* Cambridge, UK: BirdLife International (English language edition). According to that publication the reserve (37°55'N 120°44'E) covers an area of 5,300 ha, the altitude ranges from sea level up to 203 metres. It was established as a nature reserve in 1982, and upgraded to a national nature reserve in 1988.

The Changdao Islands (Changshan Liedao) lie at the junction of the Yellow Sea and Gulf of Bohai in the strait between the Shandong and Liaodong peninsulas. The IBA is a migratory bottleneck for birds, and more than one million birds apparently migrate through the islands annually. One of China's most important bird-banding stations is on Daheishan Dao ('Big Black Mountain Island') – though foreigners are not allowed to visit the latter island and are restricted to just four of the archipelago's islands – the main island Nan Changdao and the contiguous Bei Changdao as well as a couple of the other close ones.

Three globally threatened species are listed in the BirdLife IBA publication for Changdao – Red-crowned Crane *Grus japonensis* (EN), Imperial Eagle *Aquila heliaca* (VU) & Great Bustard *Otis tarda* (VU) but all three, especially the first mentioned, must be very rare here. I saw a fourth globally threatened species, Chinese Egret *Egretta eulophotes* (VU) during my current visit.

There are several inter-island ferries running from the main port in Changdao & there are also several ferries running from Yantai to Dalian & back. Qingyu & me took one of the ferries from Yantai to Dalian at the end of our stay – and it was very productive.

This stunningly attractive coastal site is right at the north-western corner of Bei Changdao. We'd no sooner arrived than a strong passage of Eastern Buzzards started. We spent two hours at this site – much of it watching the raptors migrating southwest or looking at the Pelagic Cormorants out on one of the rocky skerries. Birds here included –

This small freshwater pool (perhaps 70 metres long and 30 metres wide) is the only one of its kind on the entire island and was apparently created by an exceptionally heavy rain storm two or three years ago. There's a large dam on the eastern, or coastal side, while the southern edge of the lake is given over to cultivation. We initially scanned the pool from the road, then drove up to the Xianjingyuan tourist site car park before wandering off to view the sea for a short while. After that we walked back down, out across the dam and anticlockwise back around the small pool. It held a decent array of species today including –

Incredibly the skies suddenly cleared at 09h00 and there was a sudden surge of raptors heading south. It remained immaculately clear all day and well in to the night but the strong northerly wind stayed with us until the late afternoon when it abated. The pressure remained stable all day – and it was 1021 hPa at 19h45.

I left the Changdao Shiji Jiari Hotel area ('Century Holiday Hotel') at 05h10 & walked about 400 metres to the small ornamental pagoda overlooking Moon Bay. I spent the early morning there. There were decent numbers of passerines coming in off the sea & I spent the first hour of sunlight watching these. Qingyu had to return to Beijing today & I joined her for the ferry ride back to the mainland. Once there I took the very next ferry back to Changdao! I'd hoped to have seen something as good as the Long-tailed Jaeger we saw from the first ferry that we took – but I didn't. Nevertheless both boat trips were fun. Unfortunately however a paranoid soldier had seen me on the ferry and had noticed I had binoculars and was writing notes. He'd telephoned ahead and the Changdao police were waiting for me when the ferry docked! I then spent a full hour in the police station during which time they made numerous phone calls, perused my notebook (none of them could speak or read any English) and glimpsed my passport. Suddenly it was all over & I was released! A scary episode and one I'm not eager to repeat! They clearly thought that I was a spy!

After that I teamed up again with taxi driver Mr. Fan and the two of us headed off back to Diao Yu Gang at the north-western end of the island. It was fairly quiet here – I could see some raptors but they were all very, very distant so we set off again trying to find a higher elevation vantage point where they might be visible. We found two watch points that looked promising – but both had military hard ware on them &, having been detained once already, I was terrified (as was my driver whose telephone number the police now had). In the event we found a reasonable vantage point about 500 metres inland from the beach at Moon Bay. I dismissed Mr. Fan & spent the rest of the afternoon between there and the hotel.

There was another impressive influx of passerines in to the Moon Bay area in the early morning and today there was a modest movement of waterfowl and another midday/early afternoon movement of raptors including eight Northern Goshawks, 346 Eastern Buzzards & 90 Amur Falcons. The undoubted rarity of the day was a young Bearded Reedling in a tiny marsh on the edge of Moon Bay.

<u>Weather</u> 13°C, 1019 hPa and with a strong south-south-westerly wind in Moon Bay at 05h30. Visibility remained excellent all day.

Saturday 16 October 2010. All day Changdao, Penglai.

I left the Changdao Shiji Jiari Hotel area ('Century Holiday Hotel') too early at 05h00 & walked about 400 metres back to the small ornamental pagoda overlooking Moon Bay. I spent the early morning there – but nothing was coming in off the sea so I soon moved on and spent several hours exploring the scrub and tiny (20 x 15 metres) fragmites bed between the hotel and the bay.

Mr. Fan arrived at 09h40 & the two of us headed off. Our first stop was at Gu Shan harbour – a small fishing harbour very slightly south of the harbour at Diao Yu Dao. After about ten minutes scanning the bay here I headed back down the road walking back towards Changdao town.

After several hours here we headed back to the small pool at Wang Gou but there was now a very strong easterly wind blowing right across this small pool & consequently most of the birds on it were sheltering. In the event I only spent a short while here before noticing a small passage of raptors. They were heading south down the island & I set about trying to find a decent vantage point. We did just that – at Feng Shan ('Beacon Mountain').

Similar to yesterday I spent the last hour between the tourist complex in Moon Bay and the hotel.

Site 1. Changdao Shiji Jiari ('Century Holiday') Hotel & Moon Bay area. (39°59.3'N., 120°42.2'E.). 05h10-09h30 & again 15h45-16h40.

Site 2. Gu Shan Matou (Gu Shan Fishing Harbour). 10h00-13h20.

This site is about 1.5 kilometres south of Diao Yu Dao Gang (or Diao Yu Dao Jingqu or Diao Yu Dao Matou). After just 10 minutes scanning the rather unproductive bay from the end of the road near the fishing harbour I walked back towards Changdao town. I spent much of the time in the woodland bordering the eastern, inland side of the road with Mr. Fan catching me up at intervals. There were several wooded gullies that offered shelter from the now very strong easterly wind. They held a reasonable

number of migrants with the most notable being a single Lanceolated Warbler, Grey-backed Thrush, 16 Orange-flanked Bluetails, one Brown & four Taiga Flycatchers, four Tristram's and no less five Yellow-browed Buntings.

<u>Site 3. Wang Gou cun shuitang – small pool on the edge of Wang Gou village & on the road to the Xianjingyuan tourist</u> <u>site. (37°56.12'N., 120°44.58'E.). 13h40-13h50.</u>

It was very windy here – with a strong easterly blowing off the sea & right over the small pool. There's weren't many birds here today.

Site 4. Feng Shan ('Beacon Mountain'). (37°56.12'N., 120°44.58'E.). 14h00-15h30.

This is one of the six main tourist site on the island for which an entrance fee is charged. You can either pay 100 yuan and be allowed to visit three of these sites within three days or pay 150 yuan & visit all six within a three day period.

There's a small car park about one kilometre inside the park and a series of steep steps lead from here the 500 metres up to the view point on the 'summit'. Unfortunately while I'd seen a few buzzards moving there really wasn't very much happening by the time I reached the summit.

There's also a tiny aviary and a museum with about 100 species of rather tired looking, mounted bird specimens. I had a quick look inside & the specimens included Japanese Quail, Common Pheasant, Tundra Bean Goose, Whooper Swan, Mandarin Duck, Eurasian Wigeon, Mallard, Northern Shoveler, Northern Pintail, Garganey, Eurasian Teal, Red-throated Loon, Streaked Shearwater, Little Grebe, Great Crested Grebe, Oriental Stork, Great Bittern, Yellow Bittern, Von Schrenck's Bittern, Striated Heron, Grey Heron, Purple Heron, Great Egret, , Chinese Egret, Pelagic Cormorant, Oriental Honey-buzzard, White-tailed Eagle, Eastern Marsh Harrier, Eurasian Sparrowhawk, Northern Goshawk, Eastern Buzzard, Greater Spotted Eagle, Common Kestrel, Eurasian Hobby, Saker Falcon, Peregrine Falcon, [Eastern] Water Rail, Ruddy-breasted Crake, Watercock, Common Moorhen, Yellow-legged Buttonquail, Eurasian Oystercatcher, Northern Lapwing, Pacific Golden Plover, Eurasian Woodcock, Whimbrel, Eurasian Curlew, Ancient Murrelet, Oriental Turtle Dove, Large Hawk-cuckoo, Eastern Grass Owl, Collared Scops Owl, Oriental Scops Owl, Little Owl, Brown Hawk-owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Grey Nightjar, Dollarbird, Black-capped Kingfisher, Common Kingfisher, Eurasian Hoopoe, Ashy Minivet, Bull-headed Shrike, Brown Shrike, Black-naped Oriole, Hair-crested Drongo, Azure-winged Magpie, Common Magpie, Bohemian Waxwing, Japanese Waxwing, Japanese Tit, Eurasian Skylark, Light-vented Bulbul, Long-tailed Tit,, White-eye sp., White-cheeked Starling, Siberian Thrush, Red-throated Thrush, Dusky Thrush, Siberian Rubythroat, White-throated Rock Thrush, Yellow-rumped Flycatcher, Pallas's Rosefinch, Red Crossbill & Hawfinch! Unfortunately it wasn't certain whether they had been collected locally or not.

Highlights of the day

With there had been a southerly wind overnight there was absolutely no influx of passerines in to the Moon Bay area in the early morning. However there were large numbers of buntings and pipits etc. in the fields immediately inland from Moon Bay. The Bearded Reedling was still present and there was a Marsh Grassbird in the only patch of fragmites that I had seen so far on the entire island! There was hardly any raptor passage today.

Qingyu told me subsequently that some Chinese birders had seen a late Streaked Shearwater somewhere in Shandong today.

Weather

14°C, 1017 hPa and with a moderate south-south-westerly wind in Moon Bay at 05h30. The sky was clear with no cloud but lower level visibility was poorer than yesterday – the islands off to the north being just about visible. The pressure had been stable and un-changed all night The pressure rose slightly in the early morning and the wind gradually shifted around to west-north-west by 09h00 & by the early afternoon it had strengthened and was easterly! This continued until after dark.

It was obvious that the strong easterly wind had continued all night and that there were no passerines moving this morning so I delayed my departure from the Changdao Shiji Jiari Hotel area ('Century Holiday Hotel') until 05h30 & then walked about 400 metres to the coast where spent the early morning doing a seawatch. Absolutely nothing was coming in off the sea but there was a modest movement of birds over it. My first of several seawatches of the day lasted from 06h00-09h30 after which I returned to the hotel for breakfast. Mr. Fan arrived at 09h45 & the two of us headed off.

Other than a disappointing half hour at Wangfu Reef at the north-eastern point of Nan Changdao I spent the entire day at just four sites on Bei Changdao. With no passerine arrival and no raptors moving much of today was given over to seawatching. Like yesterday I spent the last hour of daylight between the tourist complex in Moon Bay and the hotel.

Site 1. Changdao Shiji Jiari ('Century Holiday') Hotel & Moon Bay area. (39°59.3'N., 120°42.2'E.). 05h45-09h30 & again 16h15-16h50.

This area remains my favourite birding site on the entire island.

Site 2. Jiuzhangya Cliff. (37°59.37'N., 120°41.12'E.). 10h30-13h30.

This popular tourist site is the very northernmost point of Bei Changdao & is just under 500 metres almost due east of Diaoyu Dao Gang. Its one of the six sites where a hefty entrance charge is levied – but it struck me as by far the best seawatching site that I'd visited so far. The modest number of gulls and waterfowl that were passing offshore were much closer here than they were at Moon Bay in the early morning.

I spent two hours (10h30-12h30) seawatching from inside the tourist complex before another hour wandering around the scrub and fields immediately to the south of the entrance gate. The woodland wasn't particularly special but there were a couple of attractive fields on the edge of the village.

Site 3. Wangfu Reef. (37°56.22'N., 120°43.98'E.). 14h00-14h30.

This small tourist site right at the northern end of Nan Changdao was unproductive and uninspiring though it does offer the best views over the bay on the eastern side of the next site - Yu Shi Jie.

Site 4. Yu Shi Jie (literally 'Jade Stone Street') also know as Da Qiao this is the narrow causeway between Bei Changdao & Nan Changdao. (37°58.17'N., 120°43.85'E.). 14h45-15h45.

A great site today. The Chinese Egret was still present – as were three fairly close Pelagic Cormorants but the big attraction were the large number of gulls loafing on the floating platforms and/or fishing buoys. When I visited this site two days previously there weren't even half this number of gulls present – and almost all of them were so far off that it was even a challenge separating Black-tailed from Mongolian Gull! Today about 400 of the 2100 Black-tailed Gulls present were sufficiently close that I could see colour bands on five of them! Unfortunately almost all of the large gulls present were still extremely distant.

It would be interesting to see if this area holds large numbers of terns during the summer & autumn. I'd speculate that if Chinese Crested Tern is ever to be seen on Changdao this would be the best place for it! Birds here today included –

Site 5. Gu Shan Matou (Gu Shan Fishing Harbour). 15h50-16h10.

This site is about 1.5 kilometres south of Diao Yu Dao Gang (or Diao Yu Dao Jingqu or Diao Yu Dao Matou).

Highlights of the day

For whatever reason (perhaps because of the easterly winds) there had been a marked influx of gulls today. I noted more gulls, especially Black-tailed Gulls & my first Siberian & Vega Gulls of the four days that I'd already spent on Changdao, during the morning seawatches. There were massively more gulls in the sheltered bay to the east of Yu Shi Jie (Da Qiao) in the afternoon.

Weather

Clear (with just 1/8 cloud cover, cooler (just 10°C), higher pressure (1028 hPa and rising to 1030 hPa by 09h30 and then remaining stable throughout the rest of the day – at least until 20h00) with a very strong east-north-east wind that had been blowing all night in Moon Bay at 06h00. The temperature climbed slowly to 16°C by 11h30 &peaked at not much more than that in the early afternoon. With the strong wind that blew all day it felt much colder.

The easterly wind had continued all night and there were again no passerines moving this morning I delayed my departure from the Changdao Shiji Jiari Hotel area ('Century Holiday Hotel') until 05h45 & then walked about 400 metres to the coast where I spent one hour doing a seawatch. My seawatch lasted from 06h00-07h00 after which I returned to the hotel, met Mr. Fan & then headed off to the ferry terminal back in Changdao town. I stopped off briefly at the Da Qiao causeway on route & caught the 09h10 ferry back to Penglai. I arrived there at 09h50 & walked slowly back to the bus station. Qingyu arrived at 11h30, the two of us had lunch and caught the 13h35 ferry back to Changdao. Mr Fan met us at the quay & took us back to the hotel. I birded there

for the last hour of daylight (mostly attempting to record the Manchurian Bush Warbler) before we returned to town for dinner & a spot of shopping.

We'd planned to leave the island about midday but it was very quite today & we left earlier – catching the 10h20 ferry back to Penglai. This took the expected 40 minutes &, once back on the mainland, we had a snack in the town centre KFC before catching a coach back to Yantai. Once there we booked our tickets for the following day's 09h00 ferry from Yantai to Dalian & took a taxi 20 minutes east to the Crowne Plaza Yantai Sea View Hotel (299 Gangcheng Dong Lu. Laishan, Yantai 264003 – tel. 0535 6899999 & fax. 6790999). Arriving at the hotel in the early afternoon we spent just over one hour on the neighbouring beach.

Friday 22 October 2010. Yantai, Shandong to Dalian, Liaoning ferry.

We had breakfast at 06h10 (ten minutes after the buffet opened) and left the Crowne Plaza Yantai Sea View Hotel in a taxi at 07h20. The drive to Yantai ferry terminal took almost 25 minutes & we arrived in plenty of time for our 09h00 ferry from Yantai across the Yellow Sea to Dalian near the southern tip of the Liaodong Peninsula.

There are four Air China flights from Yantai to Beijing area - at 08h50, 10h30, 14h30 & 21h45 & there are two additional flights over this same route with Shandong Airlines.

Ferry boarding started at 08h30 & the ferry pulled out ten minutes late at 09h10. The weather was glorious and the sea flat calm – so calm in fact that it must be very rare at any season for it to be so smooth! The car ferry took 6 hours and 25 minutes to reach Dalian port in Liaoning. Once there we had a quick snack in a nearby restaurant before taking a taxi to Dalian airport. The traffic was heavy at 17h00 on a Friday evening and the journey to the airport took a full hour. Arriving at 18h00 we were able to check in immediately for our 20h10 Air China flight back to Beijing.

The vehicle ferry was sufficiently large and stable and the weather so calm that I was able to use my tripod mounted telescope from the upper deck! Our tickets cost 130 yuan each and were the cheapest ones available on this particular boat – they gave us access to an un-numbered seat but we spent all our time on the deck and didn't even check out our seats. First class tickets cost 880 yuan/person and gave you a twin cabin with an en suite western toilet. There were also second & third class tickets – the latter cost 380 yuan/person and gave you a berth in a six person room that didn't have en suite facilities.

Yantai to Dalian

Our ferry departed Yantai at 09h00 & took 6.5 hours. There were several others available.

Yantai to Incheon, South Korea

This ferry operated on Mondays, Wednesdays & Fridays.

Dalian to Yantai

Ferries take 6.5 hours and depart Dalian at 09h30, 11h30, 14h30, 20h30, 20h45 & 22h30. Note that the light will be much worse on the Dalian to Yantai leg as you're heading south and in to the sun much of the way.

Dalian to Weihai

Ferries probably take 7 hours & depart Dalian twice daily - at 10h30 and 21h00.

Dalian to the Changhaixian Islands (the northernmost of which is Zhangzidao)

This ferry takes just 3.5 hours to reach Zhangzidao but stops at numerous other islands up the south-eastern side of the Liaodong Peninsula. This daily service departs Dalian at 08h00.

Dalian to Incheon, South Korea

Ferries run just three times per week & leave Dalian at 16h30 on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. They arrive in Incheon at 08h30 (local time) the following day having taken about 15 hours. It would be interesting to see what the return ferry time are.

15 in Penglai harbour on the 13/10/2010. Incredibly none were ever seen from the seawatches at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng!

30 on the sea well south of Linhai Park, Changdao, Penglai on the 14/10/2010.

110 in & around Penglai harbour on the 15/10/2010. Almost all of these were in the area immediately around Penglai harbour & although birds were seen almost half-way between there & Changdao none were logged for the third day running 'on the island itself.'

2 adults, the first I'd seen on the island, flew east off Jiuzhangya Cliff at the extreme northern end of Bei Changdao, Penglai on the 17/10/2010.

BLACK-TAILED GULL Larus crassirostris 黑尾鸥

- 76 were seen during the three hour (14h10-17h10) seawatch off Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 11/10/2010. (See the table below for timings). Unlike the 'Herring Gulls' about 25% of the birds logged were actually going north! The highest 30 minute count was of 37 birds between 15h30-16h00 & this included a party of 21 that followed a fishing trawler as it came close inshore.
- 74 off Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng on the 12/10/2010. There was no obvious passage all day and incredibly 74 birds were logged flying north and 73 flying south!
- 87 in northern Shandong on the 13/10/2010. 77 of these were seen moving north during the two hour morning seawatch at Cheng Shan Tou, Rongcheng while another ten were in Penglai harbour in the late afternoon.
- 550 at Changdao, Penglai on the 14/10/2010. The vast majority of these were seen on the floating pontoons and fishing buoys off the Yu Shi Jie causeway between Nan Changdao & Bei Changdao.

200 in the Changdao-Penglai area on the 15/10/2010. About 120 of these were in Penglai harbour.

150 on Changdao, Penglai on the 16/10/2010.

2800 on Changdao, Penglai on the 17/10/2010. The vast majority of these (2100 birds) were in the bay to the east of the Yu Shi Ji causeway between Bei and Nan Changdao in the late afternoon. Elsewhere 150 were in the bay off Gu Shan Matou while almost 500 were logged heading east during the day's various seawatches. Five colour banded adults were seen among 400 of the closest birds off the Yu Shi Ji causeway between Bei and Nan Changdao (37°58.17'N., 120°43.85'E.) – one had an orange band on its lower right leg (photographed); two had blue bands on their lower left legs (one was photographed); one had an orange band on lower left leg & dark (possibly blue?) band on lower right while the fifth bird had an orange band above knee on right leg. Its likely that they were all banded locally.
