# Xishuangbanna, Yunnan, China: 4-16 Mar 2014.

An at-a-glance list of 221 species of birds & three species of mammals.

<u>Please note that the following list is best considered a work in progress. It should not be quoted</u> <u>without consulting the author</u>.

Based on my field notes this brief write-up covers the birds and mammals seen on an early spring escape from Beijing with my wife, Sun Aiqin.

On arrival at Jinghong airport we were taken to Xishuangbanna Tropical Botancial Gardens [XTBG] where we stayed in a small hotel just outside (the gardens being popular with mostly domestic tourists there are plenty to choose from; the hotel inside the gardens was undergoing renovation at the time of our visit) until moving on (with WXM & GBJ) to Mengsong for two nights, and finally had a full day in Jinghong (two overnights) before returning to Beijing on an early morning flight.

XTBG proved such an enjoyable place to be based that we were quite dismayed at having taken so long to 'discover' it: this was our 3<sup>rd</sup> visit to Xishuangbanna.

We are most grateful for the help and inspiration offered by Steve Bale & Tong Menxiu, and for the hands-on help, company in the field & hospitality given by Wang Ximin, WXY, Luo Aidong, Zhao Jiangbo & Gu Bojian.

Xishuangbanna can be over-run by domestic visitors especially during Chinese holidays. Outside those holidays – even over Christmas – some hotels offer considerable discounts, at least in Jinghong. Numerous taxis cruise the streets of Jinghong, and using a local map – available in some hotels - it is easy to arrange transportation to wherever you want to go.

I would say that Xishuangbanna is a worthwhile and affordable place to go on a family holiday if you are already in China, but in terms of birds-for-your-money keen birders are advised to give it low priority: it is not as exciting as, say, W-most Yunnan (Ruili, Gaoligongshan, Tengchong etc), and not only because rampant poaching ensures that there are generally fewer birds around than one would expect.

In the species list the concept "bird-days" is used - it is the avian equivalent of man-hours, the day totals added up - it indicates relative abundance but does not consider the "problem" of lingering birds or, far from unimportant in a non-scientific context such as a birding holiday

abroad, how satisfying the encounters were. 25 bird-days for e.g. Spoon-billed Sandpiper could be one distant flock of migrating birds, gone in a flash, or one bird lingering for 25 days, offering the observers point-blank views anytime in that period...

The sequence of the bird list follows *The Howard and Moore Complete Checklist of the Birds of the World* –  $3^{rd}$  Edition (Dickinson 2003).

# **Species list**:

Bar-backed Hill Partridge Arborophila brunneopectus

Two seen poorly at Nangongshan on 7<sup>th</sup>. \*\*\*In addition, unidentified Hill Partridges were heard there also on 7+11<sup>th</sup>.

**Mountain Bamboo Partridge** *Bambusicola fytchii* One at Mengsong on 13<sup>th</sup>.

**Red Junglefowl** *Gallus gallus* 12 bird-days. Noted on five dates.

#### Silver Pheasant Lophura nychtemera

11+ bird-days at Nangongshan: six (incl three females flushed) on  $7^{th}$  & 5+ (one male & two females glimpsed) in the same exact spot on  $9^{th}$ .

**Grey Peacock Pheasant** *Polyplectron bicalcaratum* One heard at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

Chinese Pond Heron Ardeola bacchus

Five bird-days. Noted on four dates.

**Grey Heron** *Ardea cinerea* One at Botanical Gardens on 4<sup>th</sup>.

**Common Kestrel** *Falco tinnunculus* One en route back to Jinghong on 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Oriental Honey Buzzard** *Pernis ptilorhynchus* One at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

**Black-shouldered Kite** *Elanus caeruleus* One hunting the Mengsong fields on 14<sup>th</sup>.

#### Crested Serpent Eagle Spilornis cheela

Nine bird-days. Noted on eight dates – main event two (an immature & an adult separately) at XTBG on  $10^{\text{th}}$ .

#### Hen Harrier Circus cyaneus

One 2<sup>nd</sup> c-y at Mengsong on 13<sup>th</sup>.

\*\*\*The species is a rare to scarce winter visitor to nearby N Laos: Robson (2008).

#### Crested Goshawk Accipiter trivirgatus

Singles at Nangongshan on 9<sup>th</sup>, at XTBG ('circling out to NW; later doing wing-rustling display') on 12<sup>th</sup> & at Mengsong (w/ prey') on 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Besra** Accipiter virgatus One at Nangongshan on 9<sup>th</sup>.

#### Eurasian Sparrowhawk Accipiter nisus

One 2<sup>nd</sup> c-y female at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

#### \*\*\*Sparrowhawk sp.

Two (an adult & a  $2^{nd}$  c-y separately) at XTBG on  $12^{th}$ .

#### Common Buzzard Buteo buteo

Five bird-days. Noted on three dates – main event three en route between Jinghong and XTBG on 4<sup>th</sup>. One soaring at Mengsong Dam on 15<sup>th</sup> appeared to be ssp *vulpinus*, a taxon not included for SE Asia by Robson (2008) but identified on five occasions in W Yunnan (JH pers obs).

\*\*\*ssp japonicus is accepted as a full species, 'Eastern Buzzard', by e g IOC (2015).

#### Black-tailed Crake Porzana bicolor

At Mengsong one on 13<sup>th</sup> & four (two heard-onlies & two seen together) on 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Pintail Snipe** *Gallinago stenura* Singles at Mengsong on both 13+14<sup>th</sup>.

**Spotted Dove** *Streptopelia chinensis* Two at Tropical Plants & Flowers Garden, Jinghong, on 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### Emerald Dove Chalcophaps indica

Six bird-days. Noted on three dates – main event three at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

# Mountain Imperial Pigeon Ducula badia

Five bird-days. 1-2 daily at Nangongshan on 7+9+11<sup>th</sup>.

# Finsch's Parakeet Psittacula finschii

One perched in a kapok tree at XTBG on 5<sup>th</sup>.

#### Large Hawk-Cuckoo Cuculus sparverioides

Eight bird-days. Noted on three dates - just one at XTBG, on 10<sup>th</sup>...

#### Indian Cuckoo Cuculus micropterus

Perhaps the same singleton heard at Nangongshan on 7+9+11<sup>th</sup>.

#### Banded Bay Cuckoo Cacomantis sonneratii

19 bird-days. Noted on eight dates - most were heard-onlies...

#### Plaintive Cuckoo Cacomantis merulinus

Nine bird-days. Noted at XTBG on six dates - most were heard-onlies...

## Asian Emerald Cuckoo Chrysococcyx maculatus

One male at XTBG on 10<sup>th</sup> – amazingly, the two *Chrysococcyx* perched just two meters apart SW of my vantage point at 10h55, flying off together 'still in good light' ten minutes later.

#### Violet Cuckoo Chrysococcyx xanthorhynchus

One male at XTBG on  $10^{th}$  – 'looked blackish velvet w/ coral-pink bill when perched, and <u>glowing</u> violet as it flew off still in good light.'

## Square-tailed Drongo Cuckoo Surniculus lugubris

13 bird-days. Noted on seven dates at XTBG & Nangongshan.

## Common Koel Eudynamis scolopaceus

One at Tropical Flowers & Plants Garden, Jinghong, on 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### Green-billed Malkoha Rhopodytes tristis

Three bird-days – one at Nangongshan on 7<sup>th</sup> & two at XTBG on 12<sup>th</sup>.

# **Greater Coucal** *Centropus sinensis* 15 bird-days. Noted on six dates at XTBG.

#### Lesser Coucal Centropus bengalensis

16 bird-days. Noted on nine dates, incl at Mengsong (one on  $13^{\text{th}}$ ) & at Tropical Flowers & Plants Garden, Jinghong (two on  $16^{\text{th}}$ ).

**Barn Owl** *Tyto alba* One heard at XTBG on  $5^{\text{th}}$ .

#### Collared Scops Owl Otus lettia

11 bird-days. Noted on five dates – main event six heard at XTBG on  $6^{th}$ . The only one noted at Nangongshan was one calling at 09h20 on  $11^{th}$ .

#### Collared Owlet Glaucidium brodiei

14 bird-days. 4-5 daily at Nangongshan on  $7+9+11^{\text{th}}$  (incl one seen well & photographed on  $9^{\text{th}}$ ).

#### Asian Barred Owlet Glaucidium cuculoides

18 bird-days. Noted on ten dates.

# Grey Nightjar Caprimulgus jotaka

One at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Himalayan Swiftlet** Aerodramus brevirostris Two at XTBG on 8<sup>th</sup>.

Two at XTBG on 8<sup>th</sup>.

#### White-vented Needletail Hirundapus cochinchinensis

At XTBG one on  $6^{th}$ , six on both  $8+12^{th}$  & three on  $10^{th}$ . \*\*\*vide WXM these were the  $1^{st}$  records of this species at XTBG.

# Asian Palm Swift *Cypsiurus balasiensis* 310+ bird-days. Noted on nine dates.

**Cook's Swift** *Apus cooki* 47 bird-days – noted at XTBG on four dates: main event 25 seen well on 8<sup>th</sup>.

# House Swift Apus nipalensis

115+ bird-days. Noted on seven dates, incl at Jinghong on 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Red-headed Trogon** *Harpactes erythrocephalus* Two heard at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

White-throated Kingfisher *Halcyon smyrnensis* One en route back to Jinghong on 15<sup>th</sup>.

# Common Kingfisher Alcedo atthis

Five bird-days. Singles were noted on five dates, incl at Tropical Plants & Flowers Garden, Jinghong, on 16<sup>th</sup>.

**Hoopoe** Upupa epops One at Tropical Plants & Flowers Garden, Jinghong, on 16<sup>th</sup>.

**Great Barbet** *Megalaima virens* 21 bird-days. Noted on seven dates – main event eight at Nangongshan on 7<sup>th</sup>.

# **Golden-throated Barbet** *Megalaima franklinii* 22 bird-days. Noted at Nangongshan on three dates – main event 15 on 11<sup>th</sup>.

# Blue-throated Barbet Megalaima asiatica

122 bird-days. Noted on 13 dates.

**Blue-eared Barbet** *Megalaima australis* Heard-onlies at Nangongshan: two on 9<sup>th</sup> & one on 11<sup>th</sup>. Coppersmith Barbet Megalaima haemacephala

22 bird-days. Noted on seven dates at XTBG & at Jinghong.

**Northern Wryneck** *Jynx torquilla* One showing well at XTBG on 13<sup>th</sup>.

**Speckled Piculet** *Picumnus innominatus* 11 bird-days. 3-4 daily at Nangongshan & one heard at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

**White-browed Piculet** Sasia ochracea Three bird-days at Mengsong: two on 14<sup>th</sup> & one on 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Grey-capped Pygmy Woodpecker** *Dendrocopos canicapillus* Six bird-days - 1-3 daily at Nangongshan on 7+9+11<sup>th</sup>.

**Stripe-breasted Woodpecker** *Dendrocopos atratus* One at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

Lesser Yellownape Picus chlorolophus

Seven bird-days. 1-3 daily at Nangongshan on  $7+9+11^{\text{th}}$  – all but one were heard-onlies. \*\*\*In addition, one Yellownape sp. at Nangongshan on  $7^{\text{th}}$ .

Grey-headed Woodpecker Picus canus

Three bird-days at Nangongshan: one heard on 7<sup>th</sup> & two seen on 9<sup>th</sup>.

Greater Goldenback Chrysocolaptes lucidus

One heard at XTBG on 6<sup>th</sup>.

**Bay Woodpecker** *Blythipicus pyrrhotis* Five bird-days at Nangongshan: one heard on  $9^{th}$  & four (of which three were heard-onlies) on  $11^{th}$ .

**\*\*\*Woodpecker sp.** Singles heard drumming at XTBG on both 5+6<sup>th</sup>.

**Long-tailed Broadbill** *Psarisomus dalhousiae* 5+ bird-days. Heard-onlies noted on three dates – at XTBG on  $6+8^{th}$  & at Nangongshan on  $9^{th}$ .

**Blue-naped Pitta** *Pitta nipalensis* One heard at XTBG on  $8^{th}$ .

**Rusty-naped Pitta** *Pitta oatesi* One heard at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

Blue-winged Pitta Pitta moluccensis

Two singing at Nangongshan on 9<sup>th</sup> – just one seen briefly in flight...

# Large Woodshrike Tephrodornis virgatus

Six bird-days – one at XTBG on 10<sup>th</sup>, and five at c1,550m at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

# **Common Iora** Aegithina tiphia

19 bird-days. Noted at XTBG on four dates (main event nine on 5<sup>th</sup>) & at Jinghong on 16<sup>th</sup>.

# Great Iora Aegithina lafresnayei

17 bird-days. Noted at XTBG on four dates – main event ten on 6<sup>th</sup>.

# Large Cuckoo-shrike Coracina macei

Six bird-days at Nangongshan: two on 7<sup>th</sup> & four on 11<sup>th</sup>.

# Black-winged Cuckoo-shrike Coracina melaschistos

15 bird-days. Noted at XBGT & Nangongshan on eight dates.

# Short-billed Minivet Pericrocotus brevirostris

33 bird-days. Noted on four dates – main event a flock of 24 heading N at XTBG on  $10^{\text{th}}$ , landing twice for an instant.

## Scarlet Minivet Pericrocotus flammeus

49 bird-days. Noted on eights dates -1-7 on fives dates at XTBG & 5-14 daily at Nangongshan on  $7+9+11^{\text{th}}$ .

\*\*\***Minivet sp.** 15 at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

# Bar-winged Flycatcher-shrike Hemipus picatus

Nine bird-days: singles at XTBG on  $5+12^{\text{th}}$  & seven at Nangongshan on  $9^{\text{th}}$ . \*\*\*the one on  $5^{\text{th}}$  was 'advertise-calling in the top of a lone tree but getting no response...'

**Brown Shrike** *Lanius cristatus* One in XTBG on 12<sup>th</sup>.

# Burmese Shrike Lanius collurioides

Three bird-days – singles both at XTBG & Mengsong on  $13^{th}$ , and at Tropical Flowers & Plants Garden, Jinghong, on  $16^{th}$ .

**Long-tailed Shrike** *Lanius schach* Four bird-days. Noted on just three dates...

**Grey-backed Shrike** *Lanius tephronotus* One – seen both perched & in flight - at Mengsong on 15<sup>th</sup>.

\*\*\*Shrike sp.

Singles heard at XTBG on both 10+13<sup>th</sup>.

#### Maroon Oriole Oriolus traillii

76 bird-days. Noted on six dates – main event 31 at Nangongshan on  $7^{\text{th}}$ . Only noted at XTBG on  $8^{\text{th}}$  – two birds, incl a female heading N.

#### Ashy Drongo Dicrurus leucophaeus

28 bird-days. Noted on nine dates - at Nangongshan only noted on 9<sup>th</sup>, with five birds...

#### Bronzed Drongo Dicrurus aeneus

29 bird-days. Noted on four dates – two at XTBG on  $5^{\text{th}}$ , and 7-10 daily at Nangongshan on  $7+9+11^{\text{th}}$ .

**Lesser Racket-tailed Drongo** *Dicrurus remifer* Five bird-days: 1-2 daily at Nangongshan on 7+9+11<sup>th</sup>.

# Hair-crested Drongo Dicrurus hottentottus

One at Mengsong on 15<sup>th</sup>.

# Greater Racket-tailed Drongo Dicrurus paradiseus

Four at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

# White-throated Fantail Rhipidura albicollis

28 bird-days. Noted on 12 dates.

#### Black-naped Monarch Hypothymis azurea

25 bird-days. Noted on six dates – main event eight at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### Red-billed Blue Magpie Urocissa erythrorhyncha

Six bird-days. Noted on just four dates – two at XTBG on 8<sup>th</sup>, at Mengsong one heard on 14<sup>th</sup> & two on 15<sup>th</sup>, and one at Tropical Flowers & Plants Garden, Jinghong, on 16<sup>th</sup>.

**Grey Treepie** *Dendrocitta formosae* One at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### 'Eastern' Great Tit Parus minor

16 bird-days. Noted on seven dates.

\*\*\*Although the literature (e g Harrap & Quinn 1996) mostly assigns all Yunnan Great Tits to the *minor* group - *subtibetanus* except in the NE were *commixtus* (may) occur (Zheng 2005) – Harrap & Quinn (1996) state that *commixtus* occur only 'E of Yunnan', speculating that the form is 'perhaps of hybrid origin, connecting the *cinereus* and *minor* groups' - calls heard [@ Jinghong in 2006: JH] included one never heard at Kunming or Ruili, suggesting perhaps a member of *cinereus* group.

ssp *templorum* – of NE Thailand, S Laos & S Vietnam (Harrap & Quinn 1996) – appears to be the only candidate if a form of *cinereus* is involved.

#### Yellow-cheeked Tit Parus spilonotus

Three bird-days. Noted only at Nangongshan – two on 7<sup>th</sup> & one on 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Grey-throated Sand Martin** *Riparia chinensis* Two flying N at XTBG on 10<sup>th</sup>.

Barn Swallow Hirundo rustica

97+ bird-days. Noted on ten dates.

#### Dusky Crag Martin Ptyonoprogne concolor

Five bird-days. Noted at XTBG on two dates – one on  $10^{\text{th}}$  & four on  $12^{\text{th}}$ . \*\*\**vide* WXM these were the  $1^{\text{st}}$  records of this species at XTBG.

Asian House Martin Delichon dasypus 18 bird-days. Noted at XTBG on two dates – six on 6<sup>th</sup> & 12 on 8<sup>th</sup>.

# Red-rumped Swallow Cecropis daurica

28 bird-days. Noted at XTBG on six dates.

#### Striated Swallow Cecropis striolata

21 bird-days. Noted on six dates at XTBG, Nangongshan & at Mengsong.

#### Hill Prinia Prinia superciliaris

19 bird-days. Noted on four dates – one heard singing at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>, and 3-10 daily at Mengsong over 13-15<sup>th</sup>.

# **Grey-breasted Prinia** *Prinia hodgsonii* 19 bird-days. Noted on four dates.

#### Plain Prinia Prinia inornata

12 bird-days. Noted on three dates – one along the river at XTBG on  $8^{th}$ , and at Mengsong eight on  $14^{th}$  & three on  $15^{th}$ .

#### Mountain Tailorbird Orthomus cucullatus

Ten bird-days at Mengsong – four on 13<sup>th</sup> & six on 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### Common Tailorbird Orthomus sutorius

95 bird-days. Noted on ten dates at XTBG, Nangongshan & at Jinghong.

#### Dark-necked Tailorbird Orthomus atrogularis

17 bird-days. Noted on seven dates – only one away from XTBG: at Nangongshan on 9<sup>th</sup>.

#### Striated Bulbul Pycnonotus striatus

5+ bird-days. Noted at Nangongshan on 7+11<sup>th</sup>.

#### Black-crested Bulbul Pycnonotus melanicterus

28 bird-days. Noted on seven dates - only two away from XTBG: at Nangongshan on 9<sup>th</sup>.

# Red-whiskered Bulbul Pycnonotus jocosus

140+ bird-days. Noted on nine dates.

# **Brown-breasted Bulbul** *Pycnonotus xanthorrhous* Eight at Mengsong on 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Sooty-headed Bulbul** *Pycnonotus aurigaster* 64 bird-days. Noted on eight dates.

#### Flavescent Bulbul Pycnonotus flavescens

23 bird-days. Noted on three dates – seven at Nangongshan on  $11^{\text{th}}$ , and at Mengsong five on  $13^{\text{th}} \& 11$  on  $15^{\text{th}}$ .

#### Puff-throated Bulbul Criniger pallidus

30 bird-days. Noted on eight dates at XTBG & Nangongshan.

**Grey-eyed Bulbul** *Iole propinqua* 39 bird-days. 5-23 daily at Nangongshan on 7+9+11<sup>th</sup>.

# Mountain Bulbul Ixos mcclellandii

Four at Nangongshan on 7<sup>th</sup>.

## Ashy Bulbul Hemixos flavala

59+ bird-days. 10-28 daily at Nangongshan on 7+9+11<sup>th</sup>.

#### Black Bulbul Hypsisetes leucocephalus

25+ bird-days. Noted on five dates: six at XTBG on  $5^{\text{th}}$ , 4+-9 daily at Nangongshan (incl a mixed flock of four black- & five white-headed birds on  $9^{\text{th}}$ ), and just two at Mengsong (on  $14^{\text{th}}$ ).

**Striated Warbler** *Megalurus palustris* 36 bird-days: 9-17 daily at Mengsong over 13-15<sup>th</sup>.

**Chestnut-headed Tesia** Oligura castaneocoronata Singles heard calling at XTBG on 5<sup>th</sup> & at Nangongshan on 9<sup>th</sup>.

**Slaty-bellied Tesia** *Tesia olivea* One heard singing at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

**Brownish-flanked Bush Warbler** *Cettia fortipes* Noted only at Mengsong: one on 13<sup>th</sup> & five on 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### Russet Bush Warbler Bradypterus mandelli

30 bird-days. 4-15 daily at Mengsong over  $13-15^{th}$  – most were heard-only songsters but with a bit of determination several proved see-able.

#### Dusky Warbler Phylloscopus fuscatus

11 bird-days. Noted on eight dates.

## Buff-barred Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus pulcher

One at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

#### Chinese Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus yunnanensis

11 bird-days. Noted on seven dates – main event four at Nangongshan on 9<sup>th</sup>, incl a wonderfully cooperative individual which called only intermittently but allowed itself to be photographed as it fed in roadside bamboo (becoming *vide* LAD Xishuangbanna's 1<sup>st</sup> 'proven' (i e photo-documented) individual)...

## Pallas's Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus proregulus

11 bird-days. Noted on four dates – three daily at Nangongshan on  $7+9+11^{\text{th}}$  & two at Mengsong on  $14^{\text{th}}$ .

# 'Eastern' Lemon-rumped Warbler Phylloscopus forresti

Four bird-days. Noted on three dates at Nangongshan & Mengsong. \*\*\*Martens *et al.* 2004 (*vide* Rheindt 2006) elevated *forresti*, considered a synomym of *chloronotus* by Cheng (1987), to full species status, splitting it from *chloronotus* (of Nepal) which, with *simlaensis*, becomes Western Lemon-rumped Warbler. The two differ "dramatically in song and mitochondrial DNA (4.2% cytochrome-b divergence)": Rheindt (2006).

Given that the type locality for *forresti* is Lijiang, in Yunnan (Cheng 1987) it is not obvious that 'Sichuan Leaf Warbler' (used by e g IOC (2015)) is preferable to 'Eastern Lemon-rumped Warbler'.

"Presumably the hitherto unknown border between both species lies somewhere in Yunnan, Burma or north-eastern India.": Rheindt (2006). *Ahem?* 

# Yellow-browed Warbler Phylloscopus inornatus

88 bird-days. Noted on 12 dates.

#### Hume's Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus humei mandellii

Nine bird-days. Noted on seven dates. \*\*\*IOC (2015) treats *humei* & *mandellii* as conspecific, without comment.

Greenish Warbler Phylloscopus trochiloides

Five bird-days. Noted only at XTBG – three on 4<sup>th</sup> & two on 5<sup>th</sup>.

Claudia's Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus claudiae

85 bird-days. Noted on ten dates – main event 20 at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

Ogilvie-Grant's (=Kloss') Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus ogilviegranti

91 bird-days. Noted daily at both Nangongshan (main event 29 on 11<sup>th</sup>) & Mengsong (highest count 24 on 14<sup>th</sup>). \*\*\*Formerly considered conspecific with 'White-tailed Leaf Warbler' *P. davisoni*.

#### Yellow-vented Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus cantator

Eight bird-days – probably the same two individuals singing strongly at XTBG daily on  $6+8+10+12^{\text{th}}$ .

#### Grey-crowned Warbler Seicercus tephrocephalus

18 bird-days. Noted on five dates – at XTBG eight on  $5^{\text{th}}$  & three on  $6^{\text{th}}$ , and at Nangongshan 1-4 daily on  $7+9+11^{\text{th}}$ .

#### Bianchi's Warbler Seicercus valentini

29 bird-days. Noted on seven dates – singles at XTBG on  $6+10+12^{\text{th}}$ , 7-9 daily at Nangongshan on  $7+9+11^{\text{th}}$ , and two at Mengsong on  $14^{\text{th}}$ .

#### Emei Flycatcher-warbler Seicercus omeiensis

Two at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### Chestnut-crowned Warbler Seicercus castaniceps

Four bird-days. Singles at Nangongshan on 7+11<sup>th</sup>, and two at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

#### Rufous-faced Warbler Abroscopus albogularis

Four singing birds (just one seen) at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### Yellow-bellied Warbler Abroscopus superciliaris

17 bird-days. Noted on four dates – main event seven at Nangongshan on 9<sup>th</sup>.

#### Puff-throated Babbler Pellorneum ruficeps

28 bird-days. Noted on seven dates – main event 11 at XTBG on 5<sup>th</sup>.

# Spot-breasted Scimitar Babbler Pomatorhinus erythrocnemis

Two heard at Mengsong on 15<sup>th</sup>. \*\*\*vide Zheng et al. (2011) the ssp involved is odicus, part of the to-be-further-investigated 'Black-streaked Scimitar Babbler *Pomatorhinus gravivox*' of e g IOC (2015): http://www.worldbirdnames.org/bow/babblers/

#### **Streak-breasted Scimitar Babbler** *Pomatorhinus ruficollis* Eight bird-days. Noted on just five dates – main event three heard singing at XTBG on 5<sup>th</sup>.

# Red-billed Scimitar Babbler Pomatorhinus ochraceiceps

16 bird-days. 3-8 daily at Nangongshan on 7+9+11<sup>th</sup>.

#### Limestone Wren-Babbler Napothera crispifrons

37+ bird-days. Close encounters on four dates at XTBG – main event 13 on 12<sup>th</sup>...

#### Pygmy Wren-Babbler Pnoepyga pusilla

Singles at Mengsong on 13+15<sup>th</sup>.

\*\*\*^vide Inskipp et al. (2010) Pnoepyga is, based on molecular analysis, best regarded as a family Pnoepygidae, 'separated from other families within Sylviolidae by the combination of short, rounded & "cup-shaped" wings; very short or virtually absent tail; strong and long legs, with booted tarsus; cryptically patterned plumage with more or less irregular colour pattern of ventral feathers; and two colour morphs'.

#### Rufous-capped Babbler Stachyris ruficeps

34 bird-days. Noted on 11 dates.

#### Golden Babbler Stachyris chrysaea

Six bird-days – noted only at Nangongshan, with two on 7<sup>th</sup> & four on 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### Grey-throated Babbler Stachyris nigriceps

12 bird-days. Noted on seven dates – main event five at XTBG on 5<sup>th</sup>.

#### Striped Tit-Babbler Macronous gularis

84 bird-days. Noted on nine dates at XTBG & Nangongshan.

#### Chestnut-capped Babbler Timalia pileata

One seen at Mengsong on 13<sup>th</sup>.

# White-crested Laughingthrush Garrulax leucolophus

32+ bird-days. Up to 20+ (= five groups mostly heard) daily at Nangongshan on 7+9+11<sup>th</sup>.

#### Lesser Necklaced Laughingthrush Garrulax monileger

Heard at XTBG on 10<sup>th</sup>. \*\*\*In addition, unid. Necklaced Laughingthrushes at Nangongshan on both 7+11<sup>th</sup> – five on the last date were 'probably Lessers'.

**Greater Necklaced Laughingthrush** *Garrulax pectoralis* Noted on two dates at Nangongshan: heard on 9<sup>th</sup> & 13+ on 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Black-throated Laughingthrush** *Garrulax chinensis* One heard singing at XTBG on 5<sup>th</sup>.

**White-browed Laughingthrush** *Garrulax sannio* Noted only at Mengsong – two on 13<sup>th</sup> & heard on 15<sup>th</sup>.

# Silver-eared Mesia Leiothrix argentauris

21 bird-days: 4-11 daily at Mengsong over 13-15<sup>th</sup>.

# Red-billed Leiothrix Leiothrix lutea

Five bird-days – at Nangongshan one on 7<sup>th</sup> & four on 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### White-browed Shrike-Babbler Pteruthius flaviscapis^

17 bird-days. Noted on five dates at Nangongshan & Mengsong. \*\*\*^='Blyth's Shrike-babbler P. aeralatus is split from Pied [White-browed] Shrike-babbler P. flaviscapis (Rheindt & Eaton 2009)': IOC (2015).

#### Black-eared Shrike-Babbler Pteruthius melanotis

Four bird-days – two both at Nangongshan on 7<sup>th</sup> & at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

# **Spectacled Barwing** *Actinodura ramsavi*

Two heard (& seen poorly) at Nangongshan on 7<sup>th</sup>.

## Blue-winged Minla Minla cyanouroptera

19 bird-days. Noted on four dates – main event 12 at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

#### Chestnut-tailed Minla Minla strigula

One heard singing at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### Rufous-winged Fulvetta Alcippe castaneceps Six at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

# Brown-cheeked Fulvetta Alcippe poiocephala

Four at Nangongshan on 9<sup>th</sup>.

# 'Western'^ Grey-cheeked Fulvetta Alcippe fratercula

89+ bird-days. Noted daily at Nangongshan & at Mengsong on both 14+15<sup>th</sup>. \*\*\*IOC (2015) lists this species as 'Yunnan' Fulvetta.

# **Rufous-backed Sibia** Heterophasia annectans One heard & seen flying across at Nangongshan on 7<sup>th</sup> - 'odd we didn't hear more?'...

# Long-tailed Sibia Heterophasia picaoides

Three at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### Indochinese Yuhina Yuhina torqueola^

20 bird-days: 3-6 daily at Nangongshan on 7+9+11<sup>th</sup> & five at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>. \*\*\*^IOC (2015): 'Yuhina torqueola is split from Y. castaniceps (Collar 2006a, BLI 1.0)'.

Whiskered Yuhina Yuhina flavicollis 19 bird-days at Mengsong: 15 on 14<sup>th</sup> & four heard on 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### White-bellied Yuhina Erpornis zantholeuca

24 bird-days. Noted on three dates -11 at Nangongshan on both  $7+9^{\text{th}}$  & two at Mengsong on  $14^{\text{th}}$ .

#### Black-throated Parrotbill Paradoxornis^ nipalensis

A flock of 21+ at Mengsong on  $14^{\text{th}}$ .

\*\*\*^IOC (2015): 'Black-throated Parrotbill separated to genus *Suthora* (Penhallurick and Robson 2009)'.

#### **Grey-headed Parrotbill** *Paradoxornis gularis* 12 bird-days. Noted only at Nangongshan – eight on 7<sup>th</sup> & four on 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Chestnut-flanked White-eye** Zosterops erythropleurus Eight bird-days: four at XTBG on both 6+8<sup>th</sup>.

# Japanese White-eye Zosterops japonicus

12+ bird-days. Noted on three dates at XTBG, Nangongshan & Mengsong.

## **Oriental White-eye** Zosterops palpebrosus

26 bird-days. 1-10 noted on five dates at XTBG & Jinghong.

\*\*\*White-eye sp 15 at XTBG on 5<sup>th</sup>.

## Naga Nuthatch Sitta nagaensis

Singles in different places @ Mengsong on both 14+15<sup>th</sup>.

## Chestnut-bellied Nuthatch Sitta cinnamoventris

One at Nangongshan on  $9^{th}$  – 'singing out in a bare tree, vertical posture & throwing itself into it'.

\*\*\*In very nearly the same spot where seen earlier in the year: S Bale, pers comm.

#### Velvet-fronted Nuthatch Sitta frontalis

Seven bird-days. Noted on four dates – two daily at Nangongshan & one at Mengsong on  $14^{\text{th}}$ .

**Myna sp** Acridotheres sp One at Tropical Flowers & Plants Garden, Jinghong, on 16<sup>th</sup>.

# Blue Whistling Thrush Myophonus caeruleus

Four bird-days. Noted at XTBG on three dates.

# Black-breasted / Eyebrowed Thrush Turdus dissimilis / T. obscurus

One at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

# Himalayan Rubythroat Luscinia pectoralis

One male at Mengsong on 15<sup>th</sup> – 'sitting up & then photographed in rapeseed field!'. \*\*\**vide* Robson (2008) the species only occurs in adjacent SE Asia as a scarce resident [!] in N Burma, and as a vagrant to NW & C Thailand.

# Himalayan / Northern Red-flanked Bluetail Tarsiger rufilatus / T. cyanurus

Two female-types at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

#### Oriental Magpie-Robin Copsychus saularis

52 bird-days. Noted on eight dates at XTBG & Jinghong.

#### White-rumped Shama Copsychus malabaricus

24 bird-days. Noted on six dates at XTBG & Nangongshan.

#### White-tailed Robin Myiomela leucura

Three bird-days at Mengsong – two heard singing on 14<sup>th</sup> & one heard singing on 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### 'Siberian' Common Stonechat Saxicola torquatus

23 bird-days. Noted on dates – at XBGT just one (a male) on  $13^{\text{th}}$ , and at Mengsong one also on  $13^{\text{th}}$ , ten on  $14^{\text{th}} \& 11$  on  $15^{\text{th}}$ .

\*\*\*^sspp *maurus, przewalskii & stejnegeri* occur in China / Tibet. Dickinson (2003): "proposed splits of this complex species seem unsatisfactory if only in how the forms are ascribed to species", and (still) NOT elevated to full species status by e g Svensson *et al.* (2009), who treated 'Eastern Stonechat' as a subspecies group under 'Common Stonechat' and dealt with it in a separate account only 'for practical reasons'.

#### Pied Bushchat Saxicola caprata

Singles en route to Mengsong on both 13+15<sup>th</sup>.

#### Grey Bushchat Saxicola ferreus

Singles on three dates: one male [GBJ] photographed at Nangongshan on  $9^{th}$ , one heard in XTBG rubber plantation on  $12^{th}$  & one male at Mengsong on  $15^{th}$ .

#### Eastern Blue Rock Thrush Monticola philippensis^

Singles at XTBG on 10+12<sup>th</sup>. \*\*\*^ Zuccon & Ericson (2010) present evidence that *pandoo*, *philippensis* & extralimital *madoci* are as genetically distinct from *solitarius* & *longirostris* lists for SW Xizang) as from Rufous-tailed Rock Trush and should consequently be treated as separate species.

#### Rufous-gorgetted Flycatcher Ficedula strophiata

One female at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

\*\*\*In addition, three flycatchers heard at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup> may well have been this species.

#### Red-throated Flycatcher Ficedula albicilla

Three bird-days – one at XTBG on 13<sup>th</sup>, and two (incl an adult male) at Tropical Flowers & Plants Garden, Jinghong, on 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### Little Pied Flycatcher Ficedula westermanni

Eight bird-days – two heard at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup> & six at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

## Slaty-blue Flycatcher Ficedula tricolor

One male at Mengsong on  $15^{\text{th}}$ .

#### Asian Verditer Flycatcher Eumyias thalassinus

Six bird-days. Noted on four dates from 10<sup>th</sup>.

#### Pale Blue Flycatcher Cyornis unicolor

31 bird-days. Noted on six dates: one heard at XTBG on 5<sup>th</sup>, at Nangongshan six on 7<sup>th</sup>, four on 9<sup>th</sup> & <u>14</u> on 11<sup>th</sup>, and at Mengsong six (incl two females seen) on 14<sup>th</sup>.

# **Hill Blue Flycatcher** *Cyornis banyumas* 63 bird-days. Noted on nine dates – main event 19 at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Large Niltava** *Niltava grandis* Two (incl one heard singing at c1,550m) at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Small Niltava** *Niltava macgregoriae* One heard singing at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Grey-headed Flycatcher** *Culicicapa ceylonensis* 85 bird-days. Noted on ten dates – main event 30 at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Blue-winged Leafbird** *Chloropsis cochinchinensis* Six bird-days at Nangongshan: singles on both 7+11<sup>th</sup> & four on 9<sup>th</sup>.

**Orange-bellied Leafbird** *Chloropsis hardwickii* One female at Mengsong on 15<sup>th</sup>.

# **Yellow-vented Flowerpecker** Dicaeum chrysorrheum Five bird-days. Noted on four dates – at XTBG singles on both $5+6^{th}$ & two (heading N) on $8^{th}$ , and one 'seen well' at Nangongshan on $9^{th}$ .

#### Plain Flowerpecker Dicaeum concolor

112+ bird-days. Noted on ten dates at XTBG (main event 46 on  $12^{th}$  when an effort was made to count them), Nangongshan (main event 16+ on  $11^{th}$ ) & at Jinghong.

**Buff-bellied Flowerpecker** *Dicaeum ignipectum* 25 bird-days: 3-14 daily at Mengsong over 13-15<sup>th</sup>.

# **Scarlet-backed Flowerpecker** *Dicaeum cruentatum* Singles on three dates: at XTBG on 4+8<sup>th</sup> & at Manting Park, Jinghong, on 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### Brown-throated Sunbird Anthreptes malacensis

One at Manting Park, Jinghong, on 16<sup>th</sup>.

\*\*\*Only recently added to the Chinese list: male seen & photographed at Mengla Botanical Gardens, and female seen & photographed at grounds of Tropical Plants Research Institute, Jinghong, Yunnan over 14-15 Dec 2009 by Liao Xiaodong: China Bird Watch issue 71, p22.

#### Mrs. Gould's Sunbird Aethopyga gouldiae

Ten bird-days. Noted on five dates at XTBG (single males heading N on  $8+12^{\text{th}}$ ), Nangongshan (one pair on  $11^{\text{th}}$ ) & Mengsong (three on both  $14+15^{\text{th}}$ ).

#### Black-throated Sunbird Aethopyga saturata

15 bird-days: 2-8 daily at Nangongshan on 7+9+11<sup>th</sup>. \*\*\*On 9<sup>th</sup> a female was seen feeding a full-grown juvenile...

#### Crimson Sunbird Aethopyga siparaja

29 bird-days. Noted on eight dates at XTBG (main evcent seven on 5<sup>th</sup>) & at Manting Park, Jinghong, on 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### Fire-tailed Sunbird Aethopyga ignicauda

Two female-types up in a flowering tree at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

#### Little Spiderhunter Arachnothera longirostra

Eight at XTBG on 5<sup>th</sup>.

#### Streaked Spiderhunter Arachnothera magna

13 bird-days. Noted on seven dates at XTBG (incl one heading N on 10<sup>th</sup>), Nangongshan (1-3 daily) & Mengsong.

#### Eurasian Tree Sparrow Passer montanus

Not systematically recorded.

#### Red Avadavat Amandava amandava

129+ bird-days. Noted daily at Mengsong – main event c58 on 14<sup>th</sup>. \*\*\*...as was bound to happen, having gone to Mengsong hoping especially for this species, I found several individuals near Ruili within a few days of leaving Xishuangbanna! \*\*\*'The Red Avadavats once became quite common species of different bird markets in Beijing—It is easy to find 50 or more birds in a cage for sale before several years. Now the trade number of them seems in declining, but you can still see some in cage occasionally. I don't believe all of them from captive breed.': Li Xiaomai, email 19 Mar 2014.

#### **Pin-tailed Parrotfinch** *Erythura prasina*

One in flight, heading ENE, at XTBG on 12<sup>th</sup>.

**\*\***The species was added to the Chinese list only in winter 2013/2014 at XTBG, with one killed against a window resulting in several being found nearby (WXM pers com).

#### White-rumped Munia Lonchura striata

18 bird-days. Noted on four dates at XTBG (three on 8<sup>th</sup>, two on 10<sup>th</sup> & nine on 12<sup>th</sup>) & at Mengsong on 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### Scaly-breasted Munia Lonchura punctulata

96 bird-days. Noted on nine dates – main event 30 at Mengsong on 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### Grey Wagtail Motacilla cinerea

Eight bird-days: 1-4 daily at Mengsong over 13-15<sup>th</sup> & one at Tropical Flowers & Plants Garden, Jinghong, on 16<sup>th</sup>.

# White Wagtail Motacilla alba

Eight bird-days. Noted on five dates.

#### **Paddyfield Pipit** Anthus rufulus Two at Mengsong on 14<sup>th</sup>.

## Olive-backed Pipit Anthus hodgsoni

41 bird-days. Noted on ten dates at XTBG, Mengsong & Jinghong.

# **Rosy Pipit** Anthus roseus 25 bird-days at Mengsong – 23 on 14<sup>th</sup> & two on 15<sup>th</sup>.

## Common Rosefinch Carpodacus erythrinus

One heard at Mengsong on 15<sup>th</sup>. \*\*\*In addition, 35 'finches' heading N at XTBG on 8<sup>th</sup> were probably this species.

#### Little Bunting Emberiza pusilla

61 bird-days. Noted on five dates at XTBG (17 heading N on 8<sup>th</sup> & one heading N on 10<sup>th</sup>), and 1-32 daily at Mengsong over 13-15<sup>th</sup>.

#### Black-faced Bunting Emberiza spodocephala

15 bird-days. Noted at XTBG on two dates -14 on  $8^{th}$  & one heading N on  $10^{th}$ .

# Mammals:

# Northern Tree Shrew Tupaia belangeri

Two at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Inornate Squirrel** *Callosciurus inornatus* 18 animal-days. 1-5 noted on six days at XTBG & Nangongshan.

# Eastern Striped Squirrel Tamiops maritimus

12 animal-days. 1-3 noted on seven dates at XTBG & Nangongshan.

#### \*\*\*Black Giant Squirrel Ratufa bicolor

Two squirrels heard at Nangongshan on 11<sup>th</sup> were thought to be this species.
