## **ITINERARY**

Tuesday 10/11 Arrivel to Banjul and Hotel African Village at 4 pm.

Wednesday 11/11 Abuko Nature reserve and Lamin Lodge area.

Thursday 12/11 Start of four days trip to/via Tendaba, Kaur, Wassau, Georgetown, we stayed at Tendaba Bush Camp 3 nights. With birding stops at Pirang forest, Kampanti ricefields, Kiang West and several places at north bank.

Friday 13/11 Tendaba, boat tour in mangrove creeks at the northern bank of Gambia (Katchang) and Kiang West in the afternoon.

Saturday 14/11 North Bank Km 19, km 21, Kau Ur wetlands, Wassu and Georgtown

Sunday 15/11 Back to the coast with some stops.

Monday 16/11 Brufut wood and Kartong.

Tuesday 17/11 Lazy day around our hotel until leaving at 1 pm.

### Group

The birding activities and holiday were shared with old friends, Stig Larsson, Ingvar Jansson and Kristoffer Olofsson.

## Flights and hotel

We booked a "Vingresor" trip for one week, flights, hotel African Village and breakfast included, for a total fair of appr. 600 euro. African Village is a nice place to stay in with pool and own beach. You can have your breakfast looking out over the sea and all seabirds. I booked Tendaba Camp by phone, for us 650 Dalasis each/night for a single Standard/VIP including breakfast. We stayed 3 nights.

#### Guide

Vi hade lokala fågelguider, finns på alla populära ställen, Brufut, Pirang, Lamin Lodge mfl. "Blackrhino" vid Lamin Lodge är mkt duktig. Öppenmarks skådning inne i landet klarar man bra själv. **Tveka inte köp..**man får så mycket för pengarna.

### **Information on Visited sites**

Kotu Creek Course, Kotu ponds and Casino cycle track. From the bridge over the Kotu Creek, excellent views could be obtained daily of 10+ wader species, Senegal Thick-Knees, most of the heron and egret species, Hamerkops, Sacred Ibis, and many passerine species. The rice fields and wet areas between the Kotu Creek and the Casino cycle track were rather rich in birds. The Kotu Ponds contained guite a number of wader and a lot of bird-guides.



### Abuko Nature Reserve 11/11

We visited this small but very attractive forest reserve which gave a lot. Green and Violet Turacoes, African Pied Hornbill, Giant Kingfisher, Red-bellied Paradise Flycatchers, Common Wattle-eye, Yellow-breasted Apalis, Little Greenbul, Bristlebill, Beautiful and Collared Sunbird, Greater Honeyguide, Y-F Thinkerbird and Lanner. Green Vervet, Western Red Colobus Monkeys and two species of squirrels.



# Lamin Lodge area 11/11

After Lunch we met "Blackrhino" (a friend of Buba) and he joined us. He was excellent, knew every bird in the area. With eyes like a hawk, without bins and ears like an owl. All Bishops most of the small Estrildis-birds, woodpeckars, Turacoes, Babblers and even a pair of Lesser Honeyguide were about.

## **Pirang Forrest 12/11**

The shrimp farm and surrounding is not possible to visit any longer but the forest is real nice. Ask for The Guide Kausa. He showed us White-spotted Flufftail (4-5 heard, 2 seen), African Wood-owl, Green Hylia, Green Crombeck (what a tiny bird) Pygmy Kingfisher and a lot more.





Tendaba, Soma, Farrafenni, Kau Ur, Wassu, Georgetown 12-15/11

The first day of the 4-days' inland trip we drove from Bakau to Tendaba with two major stops. Pirang forest and at the Kampanti rice fields. Both stops were a very good. When we went back to the coast again a lot of raptor species were seen at Kampanti. The road is all tarmac and in perfect condition. Kiang West is always nice with all Savanna-birds. We stayed at the Tendaba Bush Camp. It is much better than ten years ago and the pool was nice. The 13/11 we made a "creek tour" to Katchang, from 08.00 - 12.00 h using a small motorboat, exploring two interconnected mangrove-fringed creeks at the northern bank of Gambia River. Interesting birds seen during this creek tour were African Blue Flycatcher 3 (seen well when I played). Woolly-necked Stork 40, Goliath-, White-backed Night Heron 4 ad and 3 chicks, Mouse-brown-, Pygmy-, Copper Sunbird, Blue-breasted Kingfisher .





In the afternoon 13/11 we visited Kiang West and The village Batteling.
We had some stunning birds here as a lovely pair of Four-banded Sandgrouse, Brown-rumped Bunting, Green-headed Sunbird, White-fronted Blackchat, African Oriole and more.





Next day 14/11 we drew to Kau Ur Wetlands passing Soma-Farafenni ferry with stops on the road. At km 21 North bank there is a good waterhole with many passerines Sahel Paradise Whyda 5 males, Sudan Golden Sparrow 2, Chestnut-backed Sparrowlark 6 for ex. Kaur Wetlands where very good, Egyptian Plover 3, Senegal Thickknee 70, Black-crowned Crane a pair and some passerins. Panchang Wetlands 30 km to the east gave a lot of birds and the first White-headed Vulture. But the best was Wassu gravels at the waterhole just north of town. There were a lot of passerines, about 70 Redthroated Bee-eaters, 50 White-cheeked Bee-eaters, 2 Zebra Waxbill and other small birds. In the air, 2 Tawny Eagles and one Rueppels Vulture. South of the city we had 15 Northern Carmine Bee-eaters on the wires. We passed Georgetown late afternoon and came back to Tendaba after dark. 15/11 we went back to African village, with stops at Kampanti and Pirang. At Kampanti again a lot of raptors appeared such as White-headed -, European Griffon -, White-backed Vulture and Booted eagle.

#### **Brufut Woods 16/11**

Also Brufut Woods turned out to be a very good for birding. It contains areas of relatively undisturbed savannah woodland and a small Wood, harbouring many attractive species. Here we found Black-crowned Tchagra, Swallow-tailed Bee-eater, Verreaux's Eagle Owl (a pair), Bearded Barbet, Longtailed nightjahr (a pair), Klaas's Cuckoo and a nice pair of Stone Partridge on the road. We then followed the road south to Senegal border.





# Kartong wetlands and Senegal 16/11.

In the afternoon we visited the wetlands. We had 5 Purple Swamphen and one Allen's Gallinule, breeding Jacanas and +100 White-headed W-Ducks. Black-crowned Tchagra were singing, and a pair of "Donkey-peckars" was found. We also payed at visit to Senegal in a wooden canoe without "passport".

- 31. **Hooded Vulture** *Necrosyrtes monachus monachus* Very common all over.
- 32. White-headed Vulture Trigonoceps occipitalis North bank 1, Kampanti 3
- 33. African White-backed Vulture Gyps africanus Kampanti 2, North Bank 2.
- 34. **European Griffon** *Gyps fulvus* Kampanti 3
- 35. Rueppell's Griffon Gyps rueppellii rueppellii: Wassu 1 juvenile



- 49. African Hawk Eagle Hieraaetus spilogaster Tendaba 2

- 51. **Grey Kestrel** Falco ardosiaceus Fairly common, regularly seen, 1-4 / day.


