Highlights

- Feeding station at Augusto Ruschi Marine Reserve with Hummingbirds galore.
- Numerous meetings with Red-billed Currasows at VALE.
- Solitary and Variegated Tinamous on the dirt tracks at VALE.
- An one-year old immature Harpy Eagle on nest.
- Rare Plumbeous Antvireo at VALE.
- Hundreds of Hummingbirds at Pousada Vita Verde feeders in Santa Teresa 14 species.
- Serra Antwren and East Brazilian Chachalaca at Três Pontões.
- Great birding at Mata dos Caetés no Cherry-throated Tanagers though.
- Restinga Antwren and watching the Atlantic Ocean at Cabo Frio.
- Despite pouring rain Slaty Bristlefront, Variegated Antpitta and Sharpbill on Teodoro trail.
- Variegated Antpitta trail-hopping and Half-collared Sparrow at lovely Itororó.
- Endemic Spotted Bamboowren, Spot-winged Wood Quail, Cryptic Antthrush, displaying Bare-throated Bellbirds at Macae de Cima.
- Rufous-capped Antthrush and lekking Blue Manakins at REGUA.
- All day above the clouds on Pico de Caledonia with at last a brief Grey-winged Cotinga.
- Swallow-tailed Cotinga at San Bernardo and also at Itatiaia.
- On a personal note: Toco Toucan!
- Easy Three-toed Jacamars at Carmo.
- Great rainforest birding at Itatiaia Robust Woodpecker and Brown Tanager!
- Black-capped Piprites at Agulhas Negras road.
- All cool-looking Antshrikes, Antwrens, Antbirds and Antvireos.

General birding and strategy

For me this was my first birding trip ever to South America. The Atlantic Forests seemed like a good starting destination with a combination of lots of endemics, threatened species and not too long transports. Brazil is a modern country and everything was pretty straightforward in terms of preparing and doing an independent trip. The downside being my lack of speaking Portuguese. If planning a trip with similar length I would suggest to cover even less sites than we did. Numbers of possible species at each site are too high, and it's always difficult to leave when you still have good birds to find. We could've skipped Itatiaia and instead spent more time around Santa Teresa, Mata de Mata dos Caetés and Nova Friburgo. We were not lucky with the weather. Heavy rain ruined most birding around Santa Teresa and a full day on Teodoro trail. Also at VALE there was a lot of rain. Fortunately days at Pico de Caledonia and Agulhas Negras road were perfectly clear. If possible it might be better to do the trip a few weeks earlier in the season, maybe September or October since song activity clearly had dropped and breeding season was clearly in full run. We did try to see (almost) all birds during the trip, we didn't generally accept heard-onlys. Despite hard work and dedicated efforts, a few birds never escaped their hidden refuges: Brown and Little Tinamous were just a few meters away, a Barred Forest Falcon called next us in thick bamboos but never made the fly-by, perhaps most frustrating was a hidden Speckle-breasted Antpitta at Agulhas Negras even though we worked our way down a valley well off road. White-breasted Tapaculo on Três Picos trail at Itatiaia was clearly marking its territory but never moved an inch closer. Equally elusive were several calling Brown-winged Schiffornis at VALE.

On the other hand, many Antbirds and Antwrens were more co-operative and put on great shows. Tanagers, another favourite group, with the splendidly coloured quartet of Gilt-edged, Green-headed, Brassy-breasted and Red-eared all being top birds. The region has golden birding opportunities with astonishing diversity and spectacular sceneries.

Logistics

Car & driving

We rented a VW 2WD 4-door, automatic. It was enough space for the three of us. On many dirt tracks we wished we'd rented a 4WD with higher clearance. But nevertheless, the VW did it's job, when we returned the car it was extremely dirty... 16-day rental with Alamo (via Unidas) from Vítoria Airport was approximately 500 USD plus another 220 USD we returning the car at Rio de Janeiro. In total we drove approximately 2700 km.

We had to wait at least 30-40 minutes at Vítoria when picking up the car before they had the car ready. At both airports there were shuttle buses from the terminal to the car rental offices outside.

Road conditions were fairly good but not more, at many birding sites you need to go on really bad dirt tracks. There is a general lack of highways. Road bumps are (too) many and not seldom ill-marked. Driving tempo was a bit too aggressive for my taste. Few if any follow speed signs, however there are signed electronicalsurveillance which seemed to reduce speed. Driving time approximations on Google Maps seemed pretty correct.

Maps

We used both Google Maps and the application MAPS.ME. The latter was really easy to use and a good way to enter points provided in other reports and to register own waypoints. Many of the birding trails we walked were to our amaze marked on MAPS.ME! At Pico de Caledonia MAPS.ME includes the easiest and best road up the mountain from Nova Friburgo, the same road is not even marked on Google Maps. So we advise visitors to use both.

Health

We didn't use antimalarial prophylaxis. You should probably take vaccination against Yellow fever before you go. There were lots of mosquitoes at VALE and REGUA, chiggers at REGUA and annoying gadflies at Agulhas Negras road.

Accommodation & guiding

VALE (-19.137492, -40.063624)

This privately owned reserve is just amazing. A must go. All meals were served at the main building, they also provided packed breakfast, on our first day in the reserve we never returned for lunch (we had some peanuts and crackers to munch on). Meals were in buffet style and you pay per weight. We had a clean 3-bed private chalet. The grounds are generally well managed with a lot of fruiting trees around.

In all we paid 420 USD for 4 nights including all meals. Booking via <u>reservas.rnv@vale.com</u> – Portuguese only but with Google translate everything worked out fine.

To visit VALE you need a birding guide, when booking the accommodation you are provided with a list of guides. We chose to contact Justiniano Magnago (jmagnago4@gmail.com). He only speaks Portuguese but with use of a translator everything worked out perfect. It also helped a lot that Anders spoke some basic Portuguese Justiniano really knows the reserve well, on our arrival he waited for us at the HQ. We got a list of birds from the reserve and used a 3-star system to mark which ones we were interested in (many of whom really weren't realistic targets). He took us around most of the reserve during three full days, we paid him 1150 BR. We can fully recommend having Justiniano as a guide!

Santa Teresa (-19.930169,-40.622388)

Pousada Caravaggio – booked via booking.com, c. 80 USD /3 pax. Clean and simple but nothing more, breakfast was great and provided although we returned first at 9AM.

Pedra Azul (-20.382886,-41.028639)

Casa de temporada Pomerana. A private house via Airbnb for 2 nights. A bit of a drive to Mata dos Caetés. If you have a higher budget we suggest that you stay at Hotel Fazenda Monte Verde with excellent birding on the grounds and much closer to Mata dos Caetés.

Eco-lodge Itororó (-22.183316,-42.295547)

We stayed three nights at fabulously located and well managed Itororó lodge at Nova Friburgo. Laundry services were available. All meals served in the main building with excellent feeders just outside (our only Azure-shouldered Tanager of the trip here), and also possible to have packed meals. Dinners were tasty. There is a genuinely lovely atmosphere to the place. There are several good trails around the lodge, we mainly birded the blue trail. We booked 3 nights including guiding with English-speaking Cirilo via Serra dos Tucanos birding tours (Andy Foster). Around 1320 USD was the total cost for 3 pax. <u>http://serradostucanos.com.br/</u>serradostucanos@hotmail.com

Cirilo was an excellent guide, helpful, polite and he knows all the calls and sites very well, he can be contacted on WhatsApp: +5521998883807

Itororó is an excellent base for exploring Serra do Mar and we could gladly have spent a few more days. <u>https://www.ecolodge-itororo.com/</u>

Nova Friburgo (-22.309212,-42.498740)

Hotel Serra Everest – after Itororó we transferred to Nova Friburgo for another 2 nights from where we planned to visit Pico de Caledonia without guide. In retrospect we might have chosen a hotel in the south-western part of Nova Friburgo to avoid some traffic and reduce the driving distance.

Itatiaia (-22.439149,-44.610164):

Espaço Gaia – via booking.com. 550 BR for 3 nights in a family bedroom. This family run hotel with only three rooms was an experience in itself. The beautiful house is located inside Itatiaia National Park between Hotel Donati and Hotel do Ypê along the road to the now closed Itatiaia Park Hotel from where the the trail to Três Picos start. The manager Hugo spoke English, and in the house also his mother and sister live. The house was decorated with impressive art works and paintings. The food was home cooked, organic and local. We highly recommend other birders to stay here as it's such an unique place, a good alternative to Hotel do Ypê, and situated very close to the (best?) birding trail - Três Picos.

Birding sites – Espírito Santo

UFES - Vítoria

(Parking -20.277106,-40.3072699)

As a first birding stop we tried the small Lagoa da Ufes and surroundings. There is a small track heading west reaching some mangrove forest. Here we tried to find Mangrove Rail and Little Wood Rail without any success, however we had our only Bicolored Conebill and Straight-billed Woodcreeper for the trip and also good views of a Grey-necked Wood Rail.

Estação de Biologia Marinha Augusto Ruschi

(-19.970537,-40.139686)

Well maintained feeders at the station and a few shorter trails, which we only briefly explored. This is probably the best site for Minute Hermit, we saw 10. And we had our only Glittering-throated Emeralds and most Bluechinned Sapphires here. An easy stop on the way to VALE from Vítoria. We had a nice seafood lunch at a beach restaurant at Santa Cruz 5 minutes north of the reserve.

Mata em Coqueiral de Aracruz

(Parking at a small construction site -19.929830,-40.136349)

A small track from the parking spot leads north-east through some secondary forest, we only spent an hour along the first couple of hundred meters. We tried this ebird hotspot which was just a short distance from Augusto Ruschi. There has been several reports of Eastern Striped (Kinglet) Manakin from here. Activity was decent and we had our first Silvery-flanked Antwren and Sooretama Slaty Antshrike. The best birds were an almost adult male White-crowned Manakin, Buff-throated Saltator and a pair of Moustached Wrens. It could be worthwhile to spend a few hours more here than we did.

VALE

(HQ, -19.137492, -40.063763)

Most birding in VALE is inside the reserve from the grid of dirt tracks through the forest. The grid is gated and Justiniano has the key. The dirt tracks were some in better and some in worse conditions, we never got stuck but on at least three occasions trees had fallen across the track and the chain-saw(!) Justiniano packed in our trunk the first morning came in handy! There were good birds to be found along many stretches of the grid and during our three full days we covered many corners of the reserve. We felt three full days was necessary to cover the site properly, two days would've been too hasty. Justiniano knows all sites, so I won't give any long descriptions and NOT to the nest site of Harpy Eagle.

*Great Potoo (-19.152856,-40.05336)

*A small circular clearing with generally good birding (-19.153073,-40.018969): Ochre-marked Parakeet. Whitewinged Potoo should be searched for here. Along the road from the gate to the clearing a lot of time was spent, some good birds: Black-headed Berryeater, Rufous-winged Antwren, Ringed and Red-stained Woodpeckers. *Good birding along this embankment through some reed-beds (-19.154501,-39.931190): Red-headed Manakin, Southern White-fringed Antwren.

*Cocoa Thrush (-19.071097,-39.899421). Bright-rumped Attila, Scaled Pigeon and Cream-colored Woodpecker

further 200 m south-east.

*Area with white sand next to a small river, some new birds: Brazilian Tanager, Swallow-winged Puffbird, Hummers.

*Outside the grid there is also the possibility to do some birding around the HQ. There is a small trail-system running south and south-west from the HQ. One trail start here (-19.147555,-40.071370) and runs a km back to the HQ, after around 100 m there is a stake-out for Plumbeous Antvireo and Pearly-breasted Cuckoo. *At the small lake 500 m WSW of the HQ we had a few waterbirds and good views of some parrots; Blue-headed and Scaly-headed.

*Around this parking lot at the visitor centre there is a stake-out for White-lored Tyrannulet and Grey Pileated Finch (-19.151494,-40.071223).

Entrance road – Reserva Biológica Augusto Ruschi

Turn-off from main road to Santa Teresa from Fundão (-19.925161,-40.456951). There is a really bad dirt track running WNW mainly uphill to the SE parts of the large Augusto Ruschi Nature Reserve (which is closed!). It takes around 45 minutes to reach the forest which starts around here (-19.911214,-40.532906), the dirt track continue to run for about 1 km through nice forest until it reaches a clearing (where we turn around), the road is apparently a dead end. Delforge mention in his report 2018 that there has been unfriendly meetings here. However we met a few cars and motorbikes, and everyone was waving and cheering. Unfortunately all birding was hampered due to pouring rain.

Pousada Vita Verde

(-19.956237, -40.606295)

Located a few minutes south of Santa Teresa this homestay holds among the busiest Hummingbird feeding stations in South America. The owner has been feeding hummers for many years and he told us the birds consume around 5 kg of sugar every day. Although low season and no guests at the moment of our arrival in the late afternoon the feeders were filled and busy. Kindly enough we were served some coffee and biscuits as we enjoyed the frenzies from the sheltered veranda while rainfall was still heavy. We estimated the following figures: Rufous-breasted Hermit 2

Scale-throated Hermit 1 Planalto Hermit 1 Sombre Hummingbird 15 Swallow-tailed Hummingbird 3 Black Jacobin 60 White-vented Violetear 10 Frilled Coquette 6 Glittering-bellied Emerald 1 Violet-capped Woodnymph 10 White-throated Hummingbird 15 Versicolored Emerald 15 Brazilian Ruby 1 Amethyst Woodstar 6 Other hummers to look for is Dusky-throated Hermit and especially Ruby-topaz Hummingbird.

Mata da Penha

Around 4 km east of Santa Teresa there is a turn-off left (-19.950705,-40.565059) on to a small track. After just a few hundred meters uphill you start to reach forest on your left side. We parked properly and continued on foot along the track, passing a clearing with a house with a barking dog before reaching a large patch of forest. The road goes on, passing a few more houses before reaching another smaller patch of forest before reaching more disturbed areas. These two small patches of woodland is a known stake-out for the localized Wied's Tyrant-Manakin which we failed to find. Once again grim rainfall hampered birding. It stopped only for short periods. The best birds we found were White-eyed and Black-capped Foliage-gleaners, Spot-billed Toucanets and Spot-breasted Antvireo. We had to rush back to our hotel in Santa Teresa to be in time for breakfast before heading on to our next destination. We would have liked to stay longer (and better weather...).

Três Pontões

Famous rock formations east of Afonso Cláudio, 2,5 h drive SW of Santa Teresa. This is a known stake-out for

Serra Antwren (-20.074873,-41.029826). We chose to drive the longer way via roads ES-264 and ES-165 to Afonso Claudio and then back to Três Pontões as we wanted to avoid smaller dirt tracks. Maybe there is a shorter way. Later we found Serra Antwren in Carmo, north of Nova Friburgo, making this side-trip not essential. However we did find East Brazilian Chachalaca and had a nice feeding flock at the Serra Antwren-site including White-throated and Scaled Woodcreepers, Gilt-edged Tanagers, Buff-fronted Foliage-gleaner and Streaked Xenops. Serra Antwren was immediately found upon arrival. The Chachalaca was found along the road (-20.062838,-41.036392).

Hotel Fazenda Monte Verde Golf & Resort

(-20.466538,-41.002778) To enter the premises of the resort you pass a security gate. We asked for and were quickly granted permission. We said we were visiting birdwatchers and that we also wanted to stay for dinner at the hotel restaurant. There are some small feeders at the hotel reception which held a Campo Troupial. Several Cliff Flycatchers were found at the chalets facing the lake. From the northern corner of the lake there is a creek running, along this creek there is a well-marked trail which we birded for almost two hours before sunset. Once the track deviates from the running creek you enter nice forest and we soon found a selection of great birds including Drab-breasted Bamboo Tyrant, Crescent-chested Puffbird, White-bibbed Antbird, Star-throated Antwren, Rufous-breasted Leaftosser, Tropical Pewee and heard a Cryptic Antthrush. Other good birds having been observed here include: Rio de Janeiro Antbird, Swallow-tailed Cotinga, Half-collared Sparrow and Black-billed Scythebill. We only explored a small section of the forest (there is a loop trail) and could gladly have spent more time. The trail is well marked in MAPS.ME.

Mata dos Caetés

One of the larger sections of remaining hill forest in Espírito Santo and one of the last refuges for the critically endangered Cherry-throated Tanager. Turn-off west from ES-164 (-20.515838,-40.986103), after 100 m there is a sharp bend left (-20.515677,-40.987137). From this point follow the main track until in reaches good forest and eventually a fork where the birding track starts to the right (-20.511755,-41.003986). There is a new unsigned locked gate here and we had to park our car (on the opposite side). From this point the main birding area starts and you should start to scan the canopy for feeding flocks hopefully finding the elusive Cherry-throated Tanager. The track continues for about 2 km until there is another locked gate (-20.501052,-41.014445), behind this second gate, the forest soon turns more degraded and you will reach a clearing. We spent most of the day between the two gates. During the day we met a handful of people who waved and seemed unconcerned about our presence. The area was generally birdy and we spent maybe to much time looking at everything else instead of focusing strictly on the canopy where the chance of finding the Cherry-throated Tanager probably is higher. The morning was fantastic, activity dropped gradually throughout the day with no real late afternoon peak. Some highlights were: Black-throated Trogon, Saffron Toucanet, Planalto Woodcreeper, Oustalet's Tyrannulet, White-throated Spadebill, Hooded Berryeater, Cinnamon-vented Piha, Pin-tailed Manakin and Sharpbill.

Birding sites – Rio de Janeiro

Pernambuca – Restinga Antwren spot – Praia Seca

This spot suggested by Gallardy 2018 was easy accessible. Within an hour after parking the car (-22.935468, -42.284492) we had found two pairs of Restinga Antwrens, Lesser Yellow-headed Vulture, Hook-billed Kite, Lemon-chested Greenlet, Brazilian Tanager and Hangnest Tody-Tyrant. And all of this was in the middle of the day. At the nearby beach we had a few terns passing during ten minutes or so.

Araruama Saltpans

It was a nice break from working through wet and muddy forest trails searching for skulkers to watch some nearctic waders. According to Honkola & Niíranen (2010) which ponds and saltpans being productive changes from year to year. While driving Estrada de Praia Seca (W of the town Praia Seca) you will have extensive saltpans on the northern side of the road. We made a few quick stops. At the most productive site (-22.923050,-42.343305) we had several larger flocks of Sanderlings, 20+ White-rumped Sandpipers, both Yellowlegs, and 2 American Golden Plovers.

Cedae trail

This excellent trail is a bit lower than Theodoro and Bamboo trails and a side track to the RJ-116 between Rio and Nova Friburgo. It's a broad track and birding is generally easy. There is a side-pocket where you can park (-22.397066,-42.579493). The track starts immediately, it only takes a few hours to do a proper cover of the site. If you have several days at REGUA/Itororó I would suggest multiple visits here. The track ends at a house by a creek where you turn back (-22.396442,-42.684391). On our morning we had Black-throated Grosbeak, Grey-

capped Tyrannulet, Black-cheeked Gnateater, Pale-browed Treehunter, Red-necked Tanager, Grey-hooded Flycatcher and Saw-billed Hermit. Cedae trail was not marked in MAPS.ME. As I reckon Cedae trail is misplaced on ebird.

Teodoro trail

A full day walking in ankle deep water and pouring rain. What madness! Park on your left (-22.376330, -42.557037), the trail is on your left, and you start by following a small drainage. Most of the trail goes through rather dense forest and it shares a lot of habitat with Bamboo trail. Eventually the trail is reaching a lower section of the RJ-116. Before that we turned back (-22.371941,-42.570109), we had a pair of Variegated Antpitta at this spot. Despite the grim weather we were able to pick up several Rufous-breasted Leaftossers, Sharpbill, Slaty Bristlefront, Yellow-browed Woodpecker and a showy Sharp-tailed Streamcreeper. Teodoro trail was marked in MAPS.ME. As I reckon Teodoro trail is misplaced on ebird.

Bamboo trail

At the opposite side of RJ-116 from Teodoro trail you will find Bamboo trail. Park the car (-22.379107,-42.551787) walk back, and turn south-east, after less than hundred meters the road forks, walk right ("Rua Edina Ribeiro") this road eventually turns into a trail (-22.380345,-42.550371). Originally we had planned to spend the whole day walking Bamboo trail (back and forth) – but that decision had soon to be changed. After 1 km there is a small creek that you have to pass. However when we reached the creek, the immense raining meant water-levels had quadrupled. The small creek had turned into a rapid stream reaching well above knee-level. Not safe, we had to turn back. According to Cirilo it's usually easily passable. So we can't really say much about the birding here. We had White-browed Foliage-gleaner and heard a non-responsive Mouse-colored Tapaculo. In my version of MAPS.ME Bamboo trail was marked, but the starting point was misplaced. Bamboo trail is rightly placed on ebird.

Macae de Cima

An excellent drivable track going south-east from RJ-116 (turn-off: -22.356864, -42.515535). Throughout a full afternoon we slowly proceeded along the track with multiple birding stops at around 5-7 places. There was a

good selection of new birds, e.g: Rufous-thighed Hawk, Ochre-faced Tody-Flycatcher, Yellow Tyrannulet. Great views of Bare-throated Bellbird (-22.363077,-42.505798). From our final stop (-22.378403,-42.482986) we continued on foot for another couple of hundred meters to an area with productive bamboo-stands (-22.379562, -42.485255) where we had an intense evening. We had close views of Bertoni's Antbird, Ochre-rumped Antbird and White-collared Foliage-gleaner while a Spotted Bamboowren started to call. After a long wait and play-back we eventually had amazing views of this endemic. Along a sidetrack downhill there was a Cryptic Antthrush calling, we made a long effort to try to see it, but only one of us had a brief open view. During the search a Spotwinged Wood Quail made a short short appearance for one of us. At dawn Barred Forest Falcon, Tufted and Giant Antshrikes started to call, of those we only managed to see the Tufted Antshrike.

Itororó

Unfortunately we never had the time to do any real exploration of the trail systems at Itororó. It's probably worth spending a full day here! We had two pre-breakfast walks along the blue trail which was very productive: Chestnut-headed Tanager and Half-collared Sparrow were only seen here and on our second morning we had cracking views of a Variegated Antpitta jumping the track. The feeders were always productive, best birds being Azure-shouldered and Magpie Tanagers.

REGUA

http://regua.org From Itororó it took around 1h40min to drive all the day down to Reserva Ecológica de Guapiaçu (REGUA). We made a short stop for some photos of the magnificent scenery (and adding Lineated and Greenbarred Woodpeckers to our list) along the way to the green trail. The road to REGUA is not gated, we parked the car (-22.421126,-42.738712) and started to walk slightly uphill from 07.00. We spent until lunch-time along the green trail. The main target Brazilian Laniisoma eluded us but we had a great selection of other stuff: Three different Rufous-capped Antthrushes, a nice lek of Blue Manakins, Scaled Antbird, Unicolored Antwren, Eyeringed Tody-Tyrant, Ochre-bellied Flycatcher.

The afternoon was spent along the wetland trail and the brown trail. We had a cup of coffee at the REGUA visitor centre (-22.453164,-42.770213) before heading out on the trails. All trails at REGUA is well marked and there is a map on a large sign at the visitor centre. The trails are covering different habitats and you could easily spend

many days here exploring the trail system. The best birds seen on the brown trail was Grey-bellied Spinetail and Long-billed Wren. Funny-looking Boat-billed Heron was a delight at the wetlands. At the parking lot there was a Three-toed Sloth putting on a great show as it slowly(!) started to get ready to eat some fruit. We didn't have time to wait at the Great Snipe displaying site. Instead we made a 5-minute stop at some near-by grasslands (-22.491801,-42.723642) where we added Wedge-tailed Grass Finch, White-browed Blackbird and White Woodpecker.

Pico de Caledonia

There are two roads from Nova Friburgo leading up to Pico de Caledonia. One of them is sealed/cobblestone all the way and at times VERY steep (barely drivable with a 2WD), the other one is a dirt track, more bumpy, less steep and longer and goes to San Bernardo before reaching the cobblestones. When going SW from Nova Friburgo toward Pico de Caledonia there is an intersection (-22.334476,-42.555750) where you can turn right reaching San Bernardo or continue straight ahead directly toward Pico de Caledonia (the latter alternative is not shown on Google Maps!). The two roads converge (-22.337088,-42.576602) from where the real climb start. We found a small side pocket a few bends up and walked uphill for 30-40 minutes before reaching the Grey-winged Cotinga-zone at the higher levels of the road. The road eventually reaches a gate to the last stairs up to the telecom towers. At the gate there was a security guard and we needed to show our passports to enter the stairways. We had two brief views of Grey-winged Cotinga and heard another two birds. There are only a few natural viewing-points from where we scanned the surrounding canopy for longer periods of time. The supporting cast is impressive: e.g. Large-tailed Antshrike, Rufous-backed Antvireo, Rufous-tailed Antwren, Rufous-tailed Antthrush, Serra do Mar Tyrannulet, Cinnamon and Diademed Tanagers, Itatiaia Spinetail (only along the stairway), Buff-browed Foliage-gleaner, Mouse-colored Tapaculo, Highland and Olivaceous Elaenias, Biscutate Swifts, Green-crowned Plovercrest etc. We failed to find Serra do Mar Tyrant-Manakin. We had incredible weather throughout the day. At first we thought we were having fog and rain all day, but soon as we climbed, we were above the clouds and had perfect blue skies for the rest of the day. Wear sunscreen(!). We could really recommend climbing all the way to the top as the view is nothing less than breath-taking.

On the way down from Pico de Caledonia we stopped at San Bernardo (-22.332477,-42.580439) and from here we immediately found a pair of Swallow-tailed Cotingas, however they were vary and within less than a minute they both took off and disappeared up the mountain. We weren't able to locate any Red-legged Seriemas at San Bernardo, maybe they have disappeared from this site.

Sumiduoro

Easy stop (-22.030766,-42.658737) on the way from Nova Friburgo to Carmo. Within 5-10 minutes we found a few Three-toed Jacamars.

Carmo

Immediately south of Carmo at a small water tower there is a thin forest patch along a dirt track (-21.947684, -42.603408). The track is going south-east and is gated. We walked a few hundred meters down the road, we soon found Three-toed Jacamar, Grey-eyed Greenlet, Rufous-fronted Thornbird and Serra Antwren. After around 1 km the forest patch is somewhat larger and worth further exploration. Rio de Janeiro Antbird has been reported.

Resende wetlands

Since the description in Honkala & Niiranen (2010) a lot has happened at Resende. We found general access to good habitat very difficult. The roads along the eastern and northern borders of the pond were all sealed and without any real side-pockets with good views of the area, there is a sturdy fence all along the road. Eventually we drove to the area south of the pond and parked (-22.451139,-44.381815). There was a trail going west from here through some bushy areas reaching grasslands and the edge of the wetland. Within less than an hour we found Ash-throated Crake, White-breasted Seedeater, Orange-headed Tanager, Wedge-tailed Grass Finch, Grassland Sparrow, Spix's Spinetail and a soaked Streamer-tailed Tyrant. Some rather scary dogs were guarding nearby cattle and made it perfectly clear we had stepped inside their comfort zone. It was a an easy stop on the way from Carmo to Itatiaia.

Itatiaia National Park

The oldest national park in Brazil, established in 1937! At the park gate you have to fill in an ambitious entrance form (in Portuguese..), you'll pay the visitor fees when leaving the park. Credit cards are accepted. We birded three main areas. All of these are well marked on MAPS.ME. 1/Três Picos trail (-22.437074,-44.608392) which starts at the derelict Itatiaia Park Hotel. It's fairly well marked. We spent two mornings here but only covered the first parts, the trail continues for 5 km. Best birds: Spot-winged Wood Quail, White-spotted Woodpecker, White-breasted Tapaculo, Rufous-tailed Attila, Olive-green Tanager, Rufous Gnateater, Drab-breasted Bamboo Tyrant, Large-headed Flatbill, Uniform Finch. 2/The trail between Hotel Donati (starts behind a small chapel) and Itatiaia Park Hotel which goes through some nice bamboo habitat – e.g. Fork-tailed Tody-Tyrant, Slaty Bristlefront, Cryptic Antthrush, Brown Tanager. 3/Hotel do Ypê, the feeders were only partially filled since very few guests stayed at the hotel at the time for our visit.

Agulhas Negras road

This famous birdwatching road (starting point: -22.375956,-44.760766) covers higher altitudes than the main area of Itatiaia. The first couple of km runs through bamboo and mid-altitude forest. There was one hour driving time from Itatiaia and we didn't reach the start of the road until 07.30. We made multiple stops along the road all the way up to the entry gate (-22.372810,-44.703789) where we turned around. There is a grove of Araucarias (-22.355950,-44.733862) roughly half-way up the mountain, here we soon found the specialized Araucaria Tit-Spinetail, and also Highland Elaenia, Olivaceous Elaenia, White-crested Tyrannulet, Shear-tailed Grey Tyrant and several flocks of Hooded Siskin. At the lower parts we made our way down a slope through dense bamboo and understorey trying to tape in a Speckle-breasted Antpitta without any success. Black-capped Piprites (-22372484,-44.752548), Golden-winged Cacique, Buff-throated Warbling Finch were other notable records while

only JN got to see the fantastic Red-ruffed Fruitcrow.

Mambucaba – Perequê

This coastal area west of Rio de Janeiro is a famous hotspot for highly endemic Black-hooded Antwren. We were too optimistic about our luck, as we reached Perequê a few hours later than originally planned. Mostly due to a fantastic morning at Três Picos trail in Itatiaia, but also due to considerably longer driving times than we had anticipated. We left Itatiaia at 10.00 and reached the parking spot at Perequê (-22.956978,-44.555178) not until 13.45. After 1,5 h without any calling or responsive Black-hooded Antwrens we had to give up, since we had a flight to catch. There is a long list of other interesting birds seen at Perequê, maybe the site is somewhat underrated. Squamate Antbird was a nice adding to our list. Birding is very easy along the road walking from the parking spot. On our way back to Rio we stopped at a gas station, borrowed a water hose and quickly washed the car. It was a mess. After returning the car (without any comments!) and reaching the terminal we were a bit surprised to find the check-in counters empty with passengers since we weren't that early. It turned out we had missed that the departure time was 22.00 and not 23.00 as we thought. In fact we were the *last* passengers to check-in...
